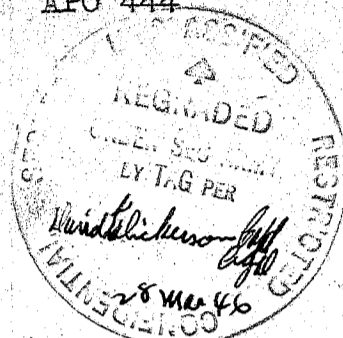

AFTER ACTION REPORT

NO 1

1. a. At 0001 April 23 this Bn was still attached to the 86th Div and the Bn (-) remained in billets at ANSBACH (0682), performed maintenance and supplied front line Units. (A + 1D and C + 2D who were on the front lines with the 86th Inf Regts.) These companies did not see any action with the 86th as the Bn received orders at 1500 23 April detaching them from the 86th Div. and attaching them to 42nd Div. Orders were received to move to 42nd Div. Area.

b. The Bn assembled at ANSBACH at 2300 23 April and Bn. commander (Lt. Col. JOHN J. CARUSONE) gave orders to the Company Commanders that the Bn would move from ANSBACH to vic WESTHEIM. (See Overlay No. 1)

c. Bn left ANSBACH at 0410 24 April and arrived at WESTHEIM at 1135. There the Bn C.O. received orders from C.G. 42nd Div to attach 1 plat of mediums and 1 plat lights to the 242 Inf Regt.

d. 1C and 1D were sent at 1800 24 April 45 and joined the 242 Inf at 2300 in vic WEMDING where they were attached to the leading Inf. Bns.

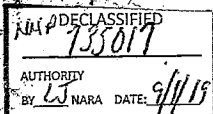
e. The Bn had E. and F. Cos 222 Inf Regt, 2 Plats A 142 Engrs and 2 plats A 692 TD's attached. Bn (-A attached to 232 Inf Regt.) and attachments moved into assembly area at WEMDING. (See Overlay No. 1) and Bn C.O. went to C.G. 42d Div for orders. Bn C.O. received orders to attack DONAUWORTH, initially with one task force along route of WEMDING, GOSHEIM, MUNDING, GUNZENHEIM, and KAISHEIM, then at KAISHEIM the Bn (+) was to make two task forces.

f. One task force consisting of D(-1plat) + F Co 222 Inf. 1 plat A 142 Engrs and 1 plat A 692 TD were to attack along route KAISHEIM, HAFENRENT, LEITHEIM, ALTISHEIM, SCHATSTALL, ZIRGESHEIM, and DONAUWORTH! (See Route D Overlay No. 2, S-3 Periodic Report)

g. The other task force consisting of B + E Co 222 Inf, 1 plat A 142 Engrs and 1 plat A 692 TD were to attack along route KAISHEIM, SCHOTTLEHOF, BERG, and DONAUWORTH. (See Route B, overlay No. 2, S-3 Periodic Report)

h. D plus attachment moved out along route from WEMDING at 0614 25 April 45. No enemy was encountered until leading elements approached KAISHEIM. There MG and some Artillery fire was received. One enemy tank knocked out. KAISHEIM was cleared of enemy at 0930.

D + attachments moved along its designated route capturing 200 PW's.

i. The other task force (B + attachments) moved along its route and encountered several road blocks, panzerfaust, mines and MG's. All were reduced after some excellent work by the task force. All towns were captured in order and the task force entered DONAUWORTH at 1700. The town of DONAUWORTH was cleared of enemy by 1900. About 200 PW's were taken.

j. C + G 222 Inf. cleared the area marked "C" on overlay No. 2 where they ran into heavy MG and small arms fire. About 100 PW's were taken and the area was cleared by 2000.

k. The Bn plus attachments outposted the DANUBE RIVER from ALTISHEIM to ERLINGSHAFEN.

1. Bn C.P. and service units moved to KAISHEIM.

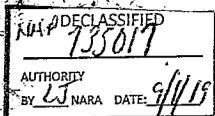

3. At 2200 25 April 45 all attachments were relieved from Bn and Bn (-A attached to 232 Inf Regt and C attached to 242 Inf Regt.) was attached to 222 Inf. D and B reported to leading Bns. of 222 Inf Regt at 0800 26 April 45. Bn C.P. and service units remained in KAISHEIM until 0555 27 April 45 at that time C.P. moved to ALTISHEIM and joined C.P. 222 Inf and moved with the 222 Inf across DANUBE RIVER to GENDERKINGEN, RAIN, and PESSENBURGHEIM. (See Overlay No. 3) S-2 and S-4 remained in RAIN to get supplies to the front line Companies. C.P. moved to OSTERZHAUSEN at 0800 28 April 45. (See Overlay No. 3) S-2 and S-4 joined Bn at OSTERZHAUSEN at 1000 28 April 45.

4. a. Companies reverted to Bn control at 1315 28 April. Bn reverted to 20th A.D. control at 1500 and assigned to CCR. Bn assembled and bivouaced vic OSTERZHAUSEN for night.

b. 0800 29 April 45 received orders to move with CCR to SCHROBENHAUSEN (See Overlay No. 4). B 27 was attached to 70 AIB B 70 was attached to Bn. Bn arrived at KOLBACH (See Overlay No. 4) at 1345 and there received orders from C.G. 20th A.D. to capture bridge at DACHAU (See Overlay No. 4)

c. Bn left KOLBACH at 1545 enroute to DACHAU and arrived at DACHAU at 1650. The 42d Inf Div had preceded the Bn to DACHAU and the bridge had been blown before arrival of Bn.

d. Bn outposted river at DACHAU. Bn CP and Service units arrived in DACHAU at 1800 29 April 45 and received a 30 minute Artillery barrage from 2015 to 2045.

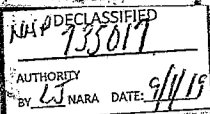

 a. Atchd to 42d Inf. Div.
4. WEATHER AND VISIBILITY: Clear and cool. Visibility, good.

5. OUR OPERATIONS FOR THE PERIOD:

- a. (1) The 27th Tank Battalion minus Co. A atchd to 232 Inf, Minus one Plat (L) and one Plat (M) atchd to the 242 Inf, Plus E and F Co. 222 Inf. 2 Plats A Co 142 Engrs, 2 Plats A Co 692 TD Bn, attacked to the South from WEMDING (1935) along the route GGOSHEIM (1930), MUNDING (2027), and GUNZENHEIM (2225), KAISHEIM (2523). No enemy action was encountered until the leading element D Co, plus a plat of TD and one (1) plat Engrs, and one (1) Company of Inf, approached the town of KAISHEIM, where it was fired upon by machine gun and Artillery fire. D Co. advanced to secure the town of KAISHEIM. At KAISHEIM the Bn was divided into two task forces. D Co. (-) Plus atchmts, proceeded along the route KAISHEIM, HAFENRENT (2822), LEITHEIM (3121), ALTISHIEM (3120), SCHAFSTALL, (2019), ZIRGESHEIM (2618), DONAUWORTH (2418). All towns along the route were taken.
- (2) B Co. and atchmts proceeded along the route KAISHEIM, SCHOTTLEHOF (240205), BERG (2419), DONAUWORTH. All towns along the route were taken.
- (3) D Co. after passing through KAISHEIM ran into machine gun and tank fire at (255830). The enemy tank was destroyed and the force continued on to each successive town along its route of advance reducing them in order. Heavy enemy resistance was encountered on the approach to DONAUWORTH. The enemy resistance at DONAUWORTH was reduced at 1800 when the left and right task forces met.
- (4) During this advance D. Co. had one man killed from artillery

fire and three men wounded. The mission of securing the bridge intact at DONAUWORTH, ZIRGESHEIM and SCHAFSTALL failed as all bridges were blown on approach.

- (5) During the attack of D. Co. many small arms and machine guns were captured or destroyed. One enemy tank was destroyed. Approximately 125 prisoners were taken and approximately 100 Germans were killed or wounded.
- (6) B. Co. plus attachments followed the 242d Inf which had a platoon of C. Co. 27th and a platoon of D. Co. 27th spearheading the attack along their route of advance to SCHOTTLEHOF. Here the Inf was held down by enemy small arms fire. The Tank platoon C. Co. 27th leading the attack ran into road mines one kilometer North of BERG and one tank was knocked out by a mine and destroyed by a bazooka. One Officer and 2 EM were killed and one was wounded in this tank.
- (7) B. Co. 27th passed through the Inf. and continued the attack on the town of BERG. Two tanks of B. Co. were knocked out by road mines. One 1/4 ton truck was completely destroyed by road mines, seriously injuring two EM. B. Co. took the town of BERG and continued the attack to DONAUWORTH where they joined up with the left column under D. Co. During the advance of B. Co. many small arms and machine guns were captured or destroyed. Approximately 100 prisoners were taken and approximately 75 Germans were killed or wounded.
- (8) C. Co. 27th (-) one platoon was held in reserve and not committed to action until the town of BERG was taken. C. Co. (-) with G. Co. 242d Inf. passed through and cleared the wooded area, running S. and E. of the route of advance of B. Co. No enemy opposition was encountered during this action.
- (9) A. Co. 27th was attached to the 232d Inf and reported to this organization at ITZING (2627). The 1st and 2d platoons were attached to the 3d Bn 232d Inf in the capture of BUCHDORF and other towns in the zone of advance and assisted in securing the bridgehead at ALTISHIEM.
- (10) The 27th Tk Bn (-) cleared and garrisoned all towns along the DANUBE RIVER in the 42d Div zone.

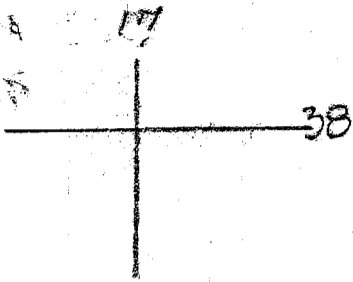

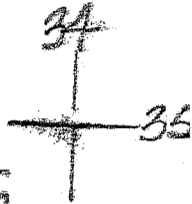

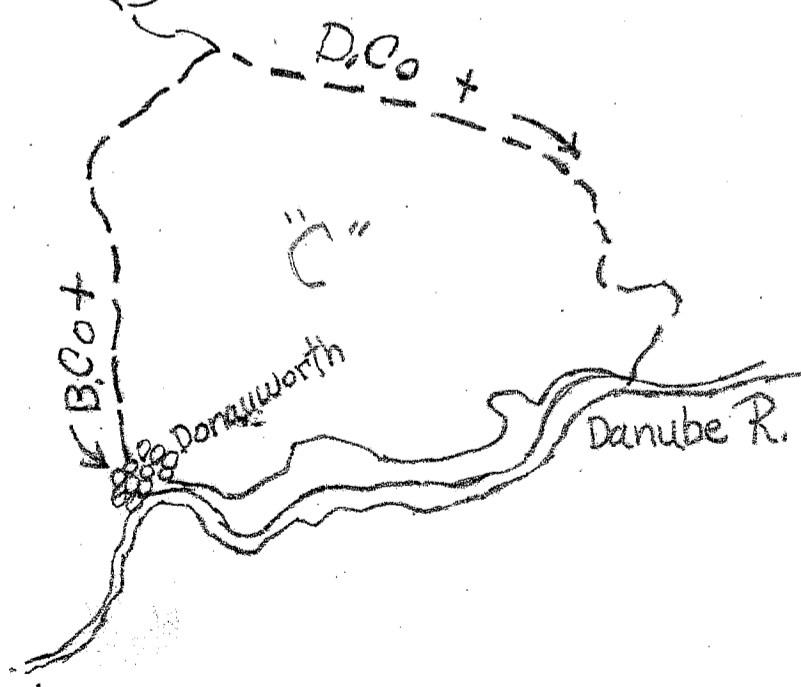

The following is a history of this company for the period 22-30 May 1945.

22 April 1945

Company was attached to the 2nd Battalion, 341st Regt, 86th Inf. Div. at Lichtenau Germany. Mission was to secure the towns of Wassermungenan, Beerbach, Masserdorf, Gusseldorf, and bridge at Spalt. Bridge was already blown up, but Spalt was occupied late on 22 May 1945. No casualties.

23 April 1945

Occupied Spalt

24 April 1945

Rejoined 27th Tank Battalion

25 April 1945

Joined 232nd Regt. 42nd Inf Div. at Fünfstetten. 1st, and 2nd platoons with 3rd Bn, 3rd platoon with 2nd Bn. 1st and 2nd platoons closely supported the Inf. in their drive through Dating, Graisbach, Leitham, and Altisheins. 3rd Platoon supported the 2nd Bn in their drive through Buchsdorf, Hafenrint, and Altinsheins. All platoons supported the Inf. across the Danube river. No casualties.

26 April 1945

Crossed the Dunube river and moved into an assembly position. No casualties.

27 April 1945

1st platoon joined the 1st Bn and occupied Neider Schoenfield. 2nd platoon joined 3rd Bn and occupied Wain. 3rd platoon with the 2nd Bn occupied Unter Baar. No casualties.

28 April 1945

Rejoined 27th Tank Battalion

29 April 1945

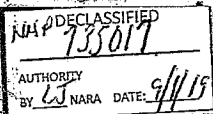
Moved to Dachau

30 April 1945

Joined 2nd Bn 222nd Regt, 42nd Div. Drove on into Munich in the afternoon, and secured bridges on Isar river. No casualties.

SUBJECT: Company History, 21 April thru 2 May 1945.

21 April 1945.

Company in bivouac area Wurzburg, Germany. Strafed by enemy plane, no casualties.

22 April 1945.

Company moved to Ansbach, no enemy contact.

23 April 1945.

Company in Ansbach, Germany. Prepared to make an attack as part of 27th Tank Battalion. No enemy contact. Order to attack was rescinded.

24 April 1945.

Company moved into position north of Donauwarth, Germany. Attached to 2nd Battalion 222 Infantry Regiment, 42nd Division. Prepared to attack and secure bridge head on Danube River South of Donauwarth.

25 April 1945.

Company moved into attack. Contacted enemy 0900 south of Kisheim. Received artillery fire. Took Berg and Donauwarth, Germany after combatting stiff enemy resistance. One (1) Enlisted Man killed, two (2) wounded, last two (2) by tank mines. Received artillery fire during night.

26 April 1945.

Headquarters and 2nd platoon remained in Donauwarth. First and 3rd platoon on security of bridge on Danube River south of Donauwarth. First and 3rd platoon under heavy artillery fire from enemy during security mission. At 1400 company moved into assembly position near Marksheim, Germany to cross Danube River. Position strafed by enemy planes.

27 April 1945.

Company attached to 222nd Infantry Regiment. Crossed Danube 0600. Moved into crossing position of Leach River at 1300. Crossed river at 1630. Company moved into the attack at Rain, Germany. Moved south toward 42nd Infantrz objective of Gunlausen. Took Bayerdelling, Wachtering, Wallerdorf, Eicheim before dark. Took Hempersdorff at 2359, bivouac position. Received spasmodic fire from enemy during night. No casualties.

Page 1 of Company History, Company "B" continued.

28 April 1945.

Received enemz counterattack 0600. Fought off and pushed enemy back. Cleared road block enabling CC B 20th Armored Division to move through toward Augsburg. Second platoon moved to Gunhausen. First and 3rd platoons moved to Schonlektion. At 1700 company reverted to Battalion control and the company assembled at Hempersdorff.

29 April 1945.

Company attached to 70th AI Battalion composing Task Force Kelly. Moved to position North West of Munich. No contact with enemy. CC B 20th Armored Division in fire fight ahead of our column. Task force Kelley moved into position to make a right attack on Menning, Germany. At 2400 orders to attack were rescinded.

30 April 1945.

At 1500 Company "B", 27th Tank Battalion was attached to the 242nd Infantry Regiment of the 42nd Division. Moved into Munich to the river. Met no enemy resistance except surrendering PW's. Infantry crossed river and out posted. Company withdrew to bivouac north of river.

1 May 1945.

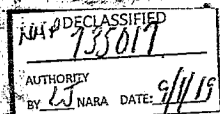
Crossed river and attacked south, met no enemy resistance.

2 May 1945.

Reverted back to Battalion controll. Moved to Zorneding.

No Action -1st Platoon detached to 2nd Battalion, 242nd Inf, 42nd Div.

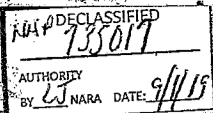
25 April 1945

1st Platoon split into two sections- 1st section went with the 2nd Bn. 2nd section of two tanks went with 3rd Bn. 242nd. With infantry support, these two sections worked in a pincer movement that was to converge at Berg, Germany, the 2nd section coming in from the northwest, the first section making a frontal attack. The first section cleared and captured Monheim, Kaisheim, Schellen Berg, and minor ~~and~~ settlements along the main route to Berg with fanatic opposition in some parts from small groups of machine gunners, snipers, etc. The German infantry, in a rather disintegrated form, held hedgerows, wooded areas, but otherwise they moved in steady retreat in face of the advance.

The second section moved in a similar action, clearing small towns and settlements without any opposition that caused a halt until the last hill was reached outside Berg.

Having cleared away several road blocks, the first section moved to within fire of a group of 88s. Flak guns opened up, of which two are known to have been knocked out by our tank gunners, on the way forward. One 88 was knocked out by our own fire, the others were put out of action by the artillery support. Moving into the last available defilade position before reaching the town, the first section commenced fire on German vehicles, machine gun nests, panzerfaust men, and the other minor opposition that guarded the approach to the town. Unknown numbers of men were knocked out in this action plus one vehicle -and at least one machine gun nest was completely annihilated. Two tanks were under fire from the 88s. Mechanical difficulties made it impossible for these two tanks to move forward with the other tank when it made its attack on the town proper. The tank had reached the center section of the town, using machine gun fire largely to clear the opposition dug in as they went. In the withdrawal that followed the wound of one man, after the infantry had arrived to hold the position taken, the tank hit a mine. The subsequent action in defense from the machine gunners and panzer faust men still left in the ditches on the edge of town, the bog was killed while throwing hand grenades at the enemy, the driver was wounded performing the same action; and an attempt to evacuate the twice wounded tank commander caused the death of the commander and his gunner. The other section was meanwhile beginning to move out of their camouflaged position over the hills to the west and were taxing the infantry to the edge of town. With a substantial number of infantry from the 3rd Bn., they entered the town, moved through it in a mopping up operation, and met D company of this battalion in Donauworth. Enemy opposition was strong and consistent. The number of casualties caused to the enemy by this section on their push to the river Danube is unknown, although 200 would be a safe estimate. They moved along the river to the site of the crossing to be built by the engineers and outposted the area for the night, exchanging fire across the river with the enemy occasionally. The remainder of the company remained in reserve at Kaisheim, where they arrived about 1330 that day. At 1700, the company moved to the woods on the southeast side of the town, and with the aid of the

Infantry swept the woods, clearing it of all the enemy, and causing the capture of over eight hundred German infantrymen.

26 April 1945.

Three tanks of the first platoon crossed the Danube river under fire at 1500. One tank was put out of action ~~xxx~~ when the bridge gave way and it went into the river. The other two tanks moved forward in support of the infantry, giving them firepower when necessary to clear the many small towns directly south of the river in that section. The company remained in reserve.

27 April 1945.

Third platoon detached to 242nd Inf. First platoon continued to move in support of the infantry.

28 April 1945.

1st platoon spearheaded battle for the town of Thierhaupten at 0730. Town was taken completely at ~~12~~ 1230. No casualties, enemy casualties undetermined. Enemy opposition, heavy.

29 April 1945.

Company reformed into one group. No action

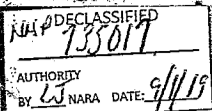
30 April 1945.

Company moved with the 2nd Bn., 242nd Inf., assembling at Passing. Moved into Munich at 1800, moved through town without opposition. Moved south on main road. The point of advance was held by a roadblock which they reduced by fire; the second and first platoon deployed to the left of the road block and undertook a fire fight with enemy foot troops defending the town of Unt-Biberg. Second platoon moved into the town with the infantry and secured the village, this action was completed at 2100. The third platoon established a roadblock on the autobahn and captured prisoners who entered from that direction; the first and second platoons deployed in the vicinity, overwatched the infantry as they sent forward patrols to the airport to the east of the town. At about 2300 the second platoon, with the aid of infantry, engaged ~~some~~ 6 88mm AA guns put them out of action. The airport and its surrounding territory were completely taken by 0600 the following morning. The 1st platoon outposted the sections taken for the night. Destroyed two enemy planes on the ground. Captured approximately 1000 Luftwaffe enemy troops and 200 enemy foot troops in conjunction with the 2nd Bn 242nd INF 42nd Inf Div. Killed 20 enemy troops.

One section of the second platoon moved forward at 1800 from Passing to capture and release unknown numbers of Allied PWs from Munchen PW camp

SUBJECT: Record of Events.

TO : S-2, 27th Tank Battalion, APO 444.

The following is a history of the Company for the period of 25 April 1945 to 30 April 1945.

25 April This company plus Fox Company of 2nd Bn 222 Inf plus assault gun platoon of 27th Tk Bn plus atchd TD and Engrs moved as a Task Force South to Donauworth, Germany In completing this Maneuver the towns of Maxhiem and Leithem Kaishiem, Altishiem were captured before entering the City Killed 250 Germans, took 150 prisoners, Destroyed one self propelled 88mm gun and occuppied the center of the town of Donauworth. Tec4 Irving Schechter was killed Sgt John R. Ophus Sgt Eldred H. McMullen and Pfc Harvey M. Stone were wounded.

26 April Relvd of atchments and assigned a sector East of Donauworth to protect by fire the formation of a bridgehead 60 prisoners No casualties.

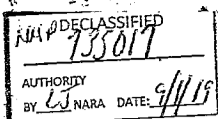
27 April Atchd 1st Bn 222 Inf Crossed the Danube river and moved South across the Salz plain took towns of Munster Unterbarr and Overbarr Destroyed 5 20 mm Flak Guns, Destroyed the observation Post for german 88mm fire falling on the Salz plain, killed 50 germans captured 25 ~~25~~ no casualties.

28 April Continued with 1st Bn 222 Inf captured towns of Neukirchen, Eisingerdorf, met light resistance in a forest on the ridge line just North of Eisingerdorf. Killed 50 germans 65 prisoners no casualties.

29 April Relvd from 222 Inf a reassigned to 27th Tk Bn moved south to Daschau Germany no contact with the enemy. Sgt Otto Belois wounded by 88mm air burst Pfc Henry W. Romanski killed by accidental discharge of 30 cal mg.

30 April Asgd 1st Bn 222 Inf entered and Occuppied the center of Munich, no resistance 300 prisoners no casualties.

SUBJECT: History of Headquarters Company

TO : Commanding Officer, 27TH TANK BATTALION

1. Following is a History of this Company for the period of 23-30 April 1945.

MORTAR PLATOON

23 April 1945 Bivouac at Westheim. Mortar Platoon attached to Company "B" 27th Tank Battalion. Mission to take Donauworth a/D and secure Bridgehead.

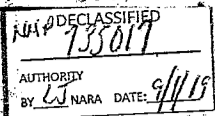
24 April 1945 The taskforce moved at 2300 23 April to Assembly area ~~Wern~~ arriving 24 April 1945. Received Artillery fire, no casualties. Moved towards objective, an roadblock over a railroad bridge five (5) km. West of Kaisheim, stopped advance. The platoon covered by M.G. fire from woods NW of RR and with Mortar fire S side of bridge, ~~advancing we~~ 20 P.W.'s helped fill blown part of same. Advancing we assisted "B" company in clearing out MG nests on outskirts of Keisheim - firing approximately 100 rounds, knocking out every enemy position. Entering the town we were counter attacked by enemy Artillery and mortar fire. No casualties. Advancing towards Berg the 42nd Inf. to which we were attached received heavy enemy small arms fire and tankers and mortars were called for support. Getting into position we covered our left flank by small arms fire, eliminating existing snipers. Mortars were called for support. Firing from the highway using about 300 rounds of HE, two sections taking advantage of treeburst killed and wounded about 50 - 60 enemy soldiers, and an undetermined number of them gave up due to mortar fire, as I had questioned some prisoners as to what type of fire made them surrender. In the meantime one section ranged in on about three nearby reported Burp guns, and with help of remaining sections the same were eliminated. After a while one Burp gun reopened fire, at which time we received artillery support after waiting for two and one half hours. The platoon was ranged in to support three individual tanks which were knocked, but we could not fire on account of friendly troops being in the area.

We returned to Keisheim for Bivouac being released from attachment. No casualties. We were shelled for a short time by enemy 88's.

25 April 1945 At noon the platoon was reattached to "B" Co. and moved to Donauworth. Again we went into position to protect the rebuilding of Bridge over Danube, in which position we were subjected to heavy enemy artillery fire for a period of approximately two hours. At dusk we advanced to an assembly area preparing to move across at dawn.

26 April 1945 We crossed the Danube and advanced towards the Seck River. About 600 yards east of the Seck river on Highway to Rain we assembled waiting for the bridge to be built which the platoon protected without firing or receiving casualties. From there

on advances were rapid halted only by occasional sniper fire. The march was ended at 2300 at Wiesbach to spend the night. No casualties.

27 April 1945 At 0600 we were counterattacked at the nearby town of Osterhausen. Firing 250 rounds of HE, M.G., and small arms an undetermined number of enemy soldiers were killed and many surrendered. The platoon supported an Engineering company attached to the task force. While removing a roadblock which had cost us a jeep with two killed and one tank knocked out by electric charges. We had no casualties.

The taskforce reverted to the Reserve when CC"B" took over.

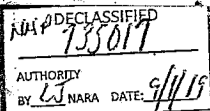
28 April 1945m We returned to Osberhausen remaining to await orders.

29 April 1945 Roadmarch as Reserve to Dachau. Short of Dachau we were ordered to take some secure Bridgeheads over Amper River. Mortar platoon was not engaged, but received artillery fire after being established in SE edge of town. We billeted there, with no casualties.

30 April 1945 m On the morning of 30 April we were attached to Company "A" 27th Tank Battakion and ordered to support the 42nd Inf. Div. in the task of taking Munich. The Mortar platoon was put behind the first leading flank that entered Munich. We received unaccurate flak to our right. After advancing for two city blocks into the City we received heavy enemy fire. The Infantry received some casualties and dismounted to take cover in the buildings. The tankers stopped and stayed in the tanks. The Mortar platoon at that time on a road junction was receiving fire also. I moved the Platoon ahead, as the roads on the junction our rear were cluttered with tanks and other vehicles, placing their sections in position. The command track went ahead to locate an O.P. In the meantime our own artillery had begun counter battery fire. At that moment I thought I had located enemy forward observer and I covered the area with HE. The enemy kept on firing at us with Artillery when I received an order to follow our own artillery fire in locating a target by smoke at a shorter range. I followed orders and using approximately 120 rounds HE, the enemy fire still kept on coming, and falling in our position. I had to move my sections again, and the enemy fire followed again. We run short of HE so I decided to cover the whole area with a smoke screen to prevent enemy forward observation. The screen covered approximately 600 yards using about 280 rounds of smoke using 4 guns.

The enemy fire ceased to fall. Infantry and tanks reorganized and moved forward into the city. The mortar platoon action now ceased at that time for the day. No casualties. The platoon used about 280 rounds of HE and 300 rounds of smoke. Within one and one half hours which was possible only due to the fact of adding two non T/O ammo trailers and rebuilding ammo bins to make room for additional ammo. My experience is to adapt only forward shooting mortars as we had rebuilt our M4AI adding ammo sections which were very appropriate.

Our action in Munich concluded actions of this platoon from 23 - 30 of April 1945.

## 2. RECONNAISSANCE PLATOON, 27TH TANK BATTALION.

23 April 1945 On the night of 23 April 1945 the Reconnaissance platoon was on a mission of zone reconnaissance from Westheim, Germany south to Wemding. We returned to Battalion in the early morning and lead the Battalion into an assembly area at Wemding.

24 April 1945 On the morning of the 24th the platoon was on a recon mission to Hosheim thence to Kaisheim where we were divided into two sections and led two combat teams in an enveloping movement on Donaworth and the bridges across the Danube River at that point.

25 April 1945 On the morning of the 25th the platoon assembled at Kaisheim under Service Company for the purpose of guiding supply trucks to the tank companies in their attack positions. For two days we remained with Service company.

26 April 1945 Work with Service Company.

27 April 1945 On the afternoon of the 27th the platoon led the Battalion across the Danube at Donaworth to an assembly position at Rains. We led the Battalion out of Rains on the 28th.

28 April 1945 On the 28th in an enveloping movement on Dachau, our platoon led the Battalion. At Dachau we received enemy artillery fire but had no casualties.

29 April 1945 We led the Battalion to Munich on the afternoon of the 29th, and remained in Munich until the morning of the 1st of May 1945.

## 3. ASSAULT GUN PLATOON, 27TH TANK BATTALION! ( Period of 23 April to 1 May )

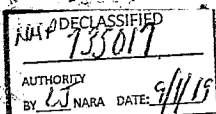
The Assault Gun Platoon was attached to Company "D" during the above period. Company "D" at this time was under the 42nd Inf. Div. command.

They moved from Ansback to Westheim where we formed tactically and received our mission. The mission of our task force was to drive south east of Donaworth secure a river crossing, and then follow the river west to Donaworth to assist in taking that town.

Moving south from Westheim we were in direct support of the leading platoon of tanks. At Kaisheim we were called upon for our first mission. Three roadblocks stopped the movement of our task force, and the Assault Guns were brought forward and the roadblocks were eliminated allowing passage of the task force immediately.

Outside of the town of Kaisheim we received a great deal of small arms fire which we dispersed and secured a great number of prisoners.

Proceeding on from Kaisheim the platoon assisted Company "D" greatly by performing reconnaissance by fire. Coming upon high ground overlooking the Danube, we spotted a great deal of enemy activity across the river. Immediately targets of opportunity were taken under fire and four enemy vehicles were knocked out: buildings in the edge of this village were taken under fire and left burning.

In this action no casualties were inflicted upon us, and our fire and air burst inflicted heavy casualties upon the enemy.

"D" Company with the Assault guns proceeded down along the river towards the bridge at Schafstall to try and make their river crossing. They pounded the buildings surrounding the approaches to the bridge, but were unsuccessful as the bridge was blown when we were less than 100 yards from the approach.

A great deal of enemy movement was noted, and we inflicted casualties upon them with both automatic fire and fire from tank guns.

Proceeding south we came upon another town, name unknown, where we again attempted to make a river crossing. The assault guns remained upon the bluff overlooking the river in support of "D" Company. Here the platoon had a big time laying time fire upon the enemy Infantry located in hedgerows. Casualties inflicted there upon the enemy exceeded forty with no casualties to our platoon.

Again the bridge was blown before we were able to make a bridge head, so our mission was changed now to the taking of the city of Donaworth from the east and attempting to secure a crossing there.

Now moving east we received constant fire from machine guns, burp guns, and snapper fire, which we were able to neutralize without losses. Arriving in the outskirts of Donaworth the bridge, was blown as we approached it, so we proceeded on into the city.

In the city we were called upon to neutralize an enemy heavily fortified building. After firing approximately thirty rounds of both HE and HEAT the building was cleared of any enemy. We did not go forward to investigate casualties inflicted.

On our passage through town we received a great deal of sniper fire which was very effectively taken care of by the Infantry. Panzerfaust teams were also at work in the city, but they did not inflict any damage to us.

Moving on through the city we met other units supported by "B" company of the 27th Tank, so we prepared to billet for the night.

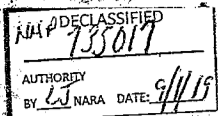
The platoon lived like kings that night with their own refrigerated brewery right at hand in the hotel we took over. We slept in the clear to provide protection from artillery fire, and everyone had a good mattress to sleep on. Morning came in no time, though, so we were then returned to the 27th Tank Battalion.

The march back to Kaisheim was uneventful and it permitted a few minutes rest for chow and maintenance, purely by the crews. We were again returned to the 42nd Inf. Division.

We proceeded to Koheim and received our mission after outposting the town with tanks and Infantry. The next morning we moved out and got as far as Genderkingen when we were required to wait a day for the bridge across the Danube to be built.

Moving out at approximately 1430 we crossed the Danube and proceeded toward our Division objective of Edenhausen.

After crossing the river we proceeded south taking the city of Rain with very little resistance shown by the enemy. About 3 Km's south of Rain enemy resistance stiffened, and the Infantry was pinned down. We blasted all the surrounding woods with heavy tank gun and machine gun fire inflicting heavy casualties which the Infantry reported to us.

A "D" company pulled up to the woods to lay heavy fire upon the enemy to the east, the Assault Guns covered their right flanks to the south. At this point we knocked out a panzerfaust team approximately 75 yards to our direct front, which would have been able to inflict heavy damage to our task force if we had not located him.

From this action we proceeded on east and cleared the town of Saltz. Here the Assault guns knocked out one 20mm flak gun and crew, and one 88mm AF gun was put out of action by accurate fire which dispersed the crew of the gun. While in this position we were fired upon by 88mm guns firing airbursts over us. The infantry suffered some casualties before our artillery silenced the guns.

Again moving south we participated in the taking of the town of Unter Barr during darkness. Here by misunderstanding of different unit locations, the Assault Gun led the assault on the town, but as no resistance was found no casualties were suffered. Here we billeted for the night. Prisoners taken in Unter Barr totaled one officer and eight enlisted men.

The next morning early we proceeded our way encountering scattered resistance. During this drive we took four towns before reaching our division objective. All the towns were softened up considerably by assault gun fire before entering and taking. Here and there road blocks were taken under fire without any casualties to us.

Our Division objective of Edenhausen provided our last action in this sector. Approaching the woods leading into town we stuck heavy enemy small arms and automatic fire. At this point every type of fire was laid on the woods, and the enemy pulled back into the town.

Passing through the woods we encountered anti-tank mines which were pointed out to us by some frantic civilians thus preventing any vehicles being knocked out.

At the exit to the woods we shelled the town heavily and knocked out one roadblock at the entrance to town. Many fires were started in the town and resistance was completely subdued. One church steeple was fired upon to eliminate snipers who had wounded one of the Infantrymen.

A report came over the radio to be prepared to move out and take under fire a German Tiger tank approaching from the northeast. We were glad it never materialized as we had four rounds of smoke left out of our entire load.

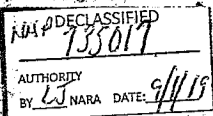
The afternoon and night we spent in Edenhausen stowing vehicles, eating, and sleeping. All the men were extremely fatigued from lack of sleep for five days, and everyone slept like logs.

Again we returned to Battalion control at Heimpersdorf where we proceeded south through Kolback to Dachau. In Dachau we experienced a rather heavy artillery barrage but everyone came through in fine shape. Artillery proves 20 men can fit under a medium tank if necessary, and boy was it necessary!

At Dachau we were again attached to the 42nd Inf. Division for their drive on Munich. The task force moved out early in the morning, and we by-passed the 9th Tank Battalion around 1230.

Coming into the outskirts we received no resistance, and entering the center of town we were dumbfounded as even Nazi soldiers were cheering us. Crowds blocked the streets making passage very difficult.

In Munich our task force freed 90% American prisoners of war, and such a happy bunch of boys could not be found under any other circumstances. They hugged, shook hands and cried with joy, and everyone of us felt like all discomforts we had experienced were well worth it.

Moving to the center of Munich we encountered some sniper fire but tank cannons put a hurried stop to that, and prisoners soon began to flow back to the rear.

We stopped in the center of the city, set up our out posts covering all approaches and serviced our vehicles.

Locating a local brewery we liberated four kegs of beer and proceeded to quench our thirst. One of the boys found a German woman working over a stove, so she ended up being our cook. Some good food and drinks put us on the pivot again, and with a few hours sleep we were again set to go.

The men of the platoon during this entire action conducted themselves in a superb manner. They proved to bea credit to their unit, and here I wish to express my admiration and thanks to them for a big job wonderfully done with no casualties. With men like these the U.S. Army has a just right to be proud of her fighting forces.

SUBJECT: RECORD OF EVENTS OF SERVICE COMPANY BETWEEN THE DATES OF 23-30 APRIL 1945.

TO : S-2, 27th TANK BATTALION, (APO 444)

THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION IS SUBMITTED TO BE ENTERED AS BATTALION HISTORY REGARDING THE DUTIES OF SERVICE CO. BETWEEN THE DATES OF 23-30 APRIL 1945:

- 23 APRIL 1945: TODAY WE ARE LOCATED IN THE TOWN OF ANSBACH, GERMANY. OUR DUTIES WERE HAULING GAS, AMMUNITION AND SUPPLIES TO THE COMPANIES WITHIN THE BATTALION.
- 24 APRIL 1945: TODAY WE MOVED ON TO WESTHEIM, GERMANY. OUR TRUCKS ARE OUT WITH THE COMPANIES WITHIN THE BATTALION SUPPLYING THEM WITH GAS, OIL, AMMUNITION. OUR WATER AND RATION TRUCKS ARE CONTACTING ALL THE COMPANIES. BATTALION MAINTENANCE BOYS STAYED BEHIND IN THE TOWN OF ANSBACH WORKING ON TANKS THAT NEEDED REPAIR.
- 25 APRIL 1945: WE MOVED 13 MILES TODAY IN CONVOY TO WEMDING, GERMANY. THE BALANCE OF THE DAY WAS SPENT ON 1ST ECHELON MAINTENANCE OF VEHICLES AND CLEANING OF INDIVIDUAL WEAPONS. WE HAD GAS AND AMMUNITION TRUCKS STAYING WITH EACH COMPANY WITHIN THE BATTALION TO SUPPLY THEM WITH THEIR NEEDS.
- 26 APRIL 1945: TODAY WE MOVE IN CONVOY TO THE TOWN OF KAISHEIM, GERMANY. BATTALION MAINTENANCE BOYS CAUGHT UP WITH US HERE AND NOW OUR COMPANY IS INTACT WITH THE EXCEPTION OF THE GAS AND AMMUNITION TRUCKS OUT WITH THE COMPANIES WITHIN THE BATTALION.
- 27 APRIL 1945: WE WERE IN CONVOY MOST OF THE DAY AND ARRIVED AT THE VILLAGE OF BEYERDILLING, GERMANY FOR THE NIGHT.
- 28 APRIL 1945: AGAIN WE TRAVELLED IN CONVOY MOST OF THE DAY AND ARRIVED AT THE TOWN OF HEIMPELSDORF AT 20000 OUR FUEL AND LUBE TRUCKS WERE STILL WITH COMPANIES WITHIN THE BATTALION AND BATTALION MAINTENANCE WERE LEFT BEHIND IN THE VILLAGE OF BEYERDILLING REPAIRING TANKS. DAILY THE BOYS PERFORMED 1ST ECHELON MAINTENANCE ON THEIR TRUCKS AND CLEANING OF THEIR INDIVIDUAL WEAPONS.
- 29 APRIL 1945: WE MOVED ON TODAY TO DACHAU, GERMANY. OUR GAS, OIL, WATER, RATION, AMMUNITION TRUCKS WERE MAKING CONSTANT DELIVERIES TO THE VARIOUS COMPANIES OF HQ, A, B, C, D, WITHIN THE BATTALION. IT WAS RATHER AN EXCITING DAY FOR US HERE IN DACHAU AS THE ENEMY SHELLS WERE COMING PRETTY CLOSE TO US.
- 30 APRIL 1945: TODAY WE MOVED ABOUT 15 MILES TO MUNICH, GERMANY. ALL ALONG THE ROAD WE WERE GREETED BY THE LIBERATED POLES AND RUSSIANS WHO WERE FREED AT DACHAU. WE SPENT THE NIGHT IN HOMES IN THE OUTSKIRTS OF THE CITY. 1ST ECHELON MAINTENANCE WAS PERFORMED ON OUR VEHICLES IMMEDIATELY UPON ARRIVAL. OUR OTHER TRUCKS SERVING WITHIN THE BATTALION WERE WITH THEIR ATTACHED COMPANIES HAULING GAS, OIL, AMMUNITION.

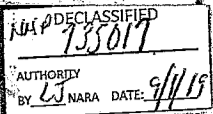

SUBJECT: History of Company from 1 - 10 May 1945

TO : Commanding Officer, 27th Tank Battalion, APO 444.

1. Following is a history of this company from 1 - 10, May 1945:

1 May 1945: Munich, Germany. This morning it is snowing and the ground is covered. We have instructions to move out around 1000 and our trucks are ready. We had nice billeting quarters here in the outskirts of Munich and the boys are all in fine spirits since we heard the city had been taken by the 27th Tank Bn., with the help of course of the 7th Army. One man was a casualty of our organization Pfc Shelton S. White 31323318. He was injured and taken to the 96th Evac. Hospital. Pfc White was riding in the back of a 3/4 ton Weapon Carrier when it collided with a tank and reports are his back was broken and a leg fracture.

2 May 1945: Today we came from Munich to Mt Schwaben, Germany and arrived at 1940. Our gas and oil trucks are with the companies of the battalion carrying fuel for the tanks. Daily we send gas and ammunition trucks back to a refueling and reloading dump so as we can have sufficient supplies for our tanks moving ahead. Also our ration and water trucks operate on the same system.

3 May 1945: We stayed here at Mt Schwaben all day performing 1st echelon maintenance on our vehicles, cleaning guns and washing clothes. Our transportation platoon gas trucks left late last night with Lt SHEEHAN for refueling.

4 May 1945: Today we moved 72 miles in convoy to the town of ND Heining, Germany, and arrived at 1950. A few of the Maintenance platoon boys were left back at Mt Schwaben to work on tanks. Twelve (12) trucks were sent back for refueling of gas and oil.

5 May 1945: Still at ND Heining, Germany awaiting "move out" orders. Vehicles are all in good shape as the boys have worked on them all day and we have our maximum supply of fuel, rations and water on hand. We have gas and ammunition trucks with each separate company of the battalion. Our gas trucks made a quick trip back to a refueling dump last night and have sufficient supply on hand for the battalion. On one of our guard posts last night, sentinels NEWMARK and MARKUNAS had two (2) Germans surrender to them and they in turn turned them over to Battalion headquarters. Battalion Maintenance has caught up with us today and outside of our Personnel section in Rear Echelon the company is intact.

6 May 1945: ND Heining, Germany. We've stayed here three (3) days now and the boys of Maintenance and Transportation platoons have things pretty well on the line. Our Maintenance boys worked quite late last night getting the remainder of the tanks out.

7 May 1945: We moved today to Lindach, Germany a distance of 48 miles and arrived there at 1715. Upon arrival we immediately sent our gas trucks back to a refueling point. One of our ammunition trucks overturned today and the driver Pfc Clarence J. Durnen 36894855 received a slight back sprain. The boys are in fine spirits as its rumored the Germans have surrendered.

8 May 1945: Lindach, Germany. VE day announced by the British today. Usual organizational duties performed of 1st echelon maintenance and cleaning of weapons.

9 May 1945: We've still in Lindach with our vehicles fully loaded with supplies

and all set to move out. Several of the boys are wearing german fur-lined jackets they picked up in a warehouse nearby. Four (4) german PW's surrendered to us this morning and were turned over to Bn Hq. The battalion sent us today ten (10) men for Special Duty and we can surely use them as assistant truck drivers. Our fuel, water, ration and ammunition trucks are in contact with the companies of the battalion.

10 May 1945: Lindach, Germany. Usual organizational duties performed today.

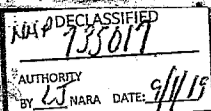

- 5 May 1945: Company moved to Gerstetten, Germany. No enemy wounded, no enemy captured, no guns destroyed, no tanks lost, no casualties. Company spent night at Gerstetten.
- 6 May 1945: Company still in Gerstetten, no events.
- 7 May 1945: 1st Platoon attached to A Co this Bn, 2d Platoon attached to B Co this Bn, 3d Platoon attached to C Co this Bn, processing prisoners, Hq section moved to Lindach, Germany, no events.
- 8 May 1945: No change.
- 9 May 1945: No change, except Nicholas Carbonaro was evacuated to hospital due to injury caused by explosion. He was from the 3d Platoon.
- 10 May 1945: No change.
