

He was awarded the Bronze Star. Late in the afternoon on the 21st, the Germans threw a small counter-attack against elements of our Third Battalion near Fremifontaine. One of the shells which they threw landed among the ammunition of the mortar section of Company M to which Private Gerald K. Tremmel, Cleveland, Ohio, belonged. The ammunition started to burn and Tremmel realized that if the fire was not put out it would cause the explosion of several hundred rounds of much needed mortar ammunition that was stacked nearby. Tremmel rushed up to the ammunition and, disregarding the probability of an explosion, went to work throwing dirt on it and carrying some of it out of the danger zone. In doing so, he suffered second degree burns on his face and arms, but he kept right on working until he had extinguished the fire. He was awarded the Bronze Star.

Entered the military service from Branz, You York.

HERY D LANTRY 32045893, Infantry, Staff Sorgoant, Company M, 180th Infantry Regiment, for heroic achievement in action on 15 October 1944 near Fromifontoine, France. Sorgoant Lentry, although exposed to heavy enemy eachine gun and small arms fire, crawled to a position from which he could direct morter fire on an enemy force which had encircled a friendly plateen. succeeded in disorgenizing the energy with his securate morter fire, enabling the encircled elateon to reach new menitions. Sorgenat Lentry's heroic action reflects credit upon himself and his organization. Entered the militory service from Helena, New York.

GERALD & TRIMMEL 33257331, Infantry, Frivate First Glass (then Trivate), Georgemy M, 186th Infantry Regiment, for hereis achievement in action on 21 October 1944 near Frenifontaine, France. During an energy counterattack the increments and assumition in Trivate Transel's merter position were set afire. Restiring that if the fire sere allowed to centinue, it would cause an explosion of several hundred rounds of assumition stacked mearby, Frivate Transel, disreparding mersonal safety, promptly extinguished the blase, suffering second degree burns in se design. He then centinued his firing mission and was instrumental in repulsing the enemy counterattack. Entered the utility service from Glaveland, Chic.

CLIRENCE O MOLFE 35097007, Infantry, Staff Sorgeant, Corrent F, 180th Infantry Regiment, for hereic achievement in action on 19 April 1945 near Immhort, Cornany.
