Proceedings of the Summary Court for disposition of effects of 1st Lt. Eugene E. Snell, O-482660, Signal Corps, appointed by paragraph 4, Special Order #95, Headquarters, Fort Pepperrell, dated 5 May 1943, a copy of which is attached as Exhibit "A", submitted on 11 May 1943, is further amended by the additional property disposition described herein. This is in addition to the property covered by original Summary Court Proceedings.

PURPOSE: All known property of 1st Lt. Eugene E. Snell was disposed of as provided by appropriate regulations on 11 May 1943. It was brought to the attention of the Summary Court on 17 December 1943, that one (1) Ford Sedan, V-8, 85 HP, Engine Number 18-1350433, was an asset of the estate of Lt. Snell at the time of his death. The statement of the Judge Advocate is included as Exhibit "B". The supporting Bill of Sale, which was unknown to the Summary Court at the original disposition, is included as Exhibit "C".

On 20 December 1943, the Court received information concerning the status of the car as an asset of the Estate of Lt. Snell. At that time, the car was in the hands of Major H.W.H. Powel, Base Command. That Officer had purchased the car from Lt. Col. Airel B. Cooper on 5 December 1943 for the sum of three hundred dollars (\$300.00) Newfoundland Currency. This amount was returned to Major Powel by Lt. Col. Cooper and the car became the charge of the Court for disposition.

The Summary Court advertised for bids to sell the car in the Daily Bulletin, dated 27 December 1943, the St. John's "Daily News" on 28 December 1943, and the St. John's "Evening Telegram" on 28 December 1943. The advertisements were submitted for publication on 24 December 1943 but were not printed until indicated dates due to holidays.

The sale of the car was retarded because of poor tires and engine.

Deadline placed on all bids was 1800NT, 29 December 1943.

FINDINGS: The Summary Court having carefully considered all facts finds:

1. That the subject car is an asset of the estate of Lt. Eugene E. Snell and should have been included in the original property inventory.
2. That Lt. Col. Airel B. Cooper, Signal Corps, financed the sale from Lt. Don Hansen (Prior Owner) to Lt. Snell by personal verbal agreement in the amount of two hundred seventy five dollars (\$275.00) Newfoundland Currency. The Court recognizes this as a lien on the car by Lt. Col. Cooper.

Proceedings of the Summary Court for disposition of effects of  
the estate of J. Edgar Hoover, deceased, are reported by page 10  
of the Summary Court Report, dated February 1, 1944, and a copy of which is attached as Exhibit "A", submitted on May 1, 1944.  
In addition to the property covered by original Summary Court  
proceedings:

1. All known property of J. Edgar Hoover, deceased, was disposed of  
as provided by the Summary Court on May 1, 1944. It was brought  
to the attention of the Summary Court on December 1, 1943, that one (1)  
Ford Sedan, V-8, 52 H.P., Serial Number 15-11111, was an asset of the  
estate of J. Edgar Hoover at the time of his death. The defendant of the  
Index Affidavit is included as Exhibit "B". The Summary Court on May 1, 1944,  
which was known to the Summary Court at the original disposition, is  
included as Exhibit "C".

In December 1943, the donor received information concerning  
the status of the car as an asset of the estate of J. Edgar Hoover.  
The car was in the name of J. Edgar Hoover, deceased. The

d. Lt. G.V. Policani.....	\$275.00


RECOMMENDATIONS: In view of the above findings the Summary Court recommends:



From an examination of the attached papers it appears that Lieutenant Eugene Snell purchased an automobile from Lieutenant Hansen. Apparently an agreement was reached between Lieutenant Snell and Lt. Col. Cooper whereby Lt. Col. Cooper advanced the necessary funds (\$275) to purchase the automobile. Lieut. Snell received the title papers to the automobile but did not record the transfer in St. John's. To secure Lt. Col. Cooper, Lieut. Snell "gave" the title papers to the car to him. Fifty Dollars (\$50) was paid by Lieut. Snell to Lt. Col. Cooper in discharge of his indebtedness.

It is believed that a sale of the automobile to Lieut. Snell was consummated at the time of the execution of the title papers by Lieut. Hansen and on the delivery of the vehicle to Lieut. Snell.

It would be helpful if the title papers were available for inspection. However, in the absence of the title papers, it is to be presumed from the statement of Lt. Col. Cooper that no transfer of title was made by Lieut. Snell to him as "security". With this presumption as a major premise, it can be stated that title to the car remained in Lieut. Snell, with an open debt existing between Lieut. Snell and Lt. Col. Cooper to the extent of the advance made by Lt. Col. Cooper in the purchase of the automobile.

It is therefore believed that the automobile was an asset of the estate of Lieut. Snell at the time of his death and as such should have been subjected to administration by the Summary Court, as provided in AR 600-550, 14 May 1943 and A.W. 112.

It is not believed that Lt. Col. Cooper could effectively pass title to the automobile to Major Powell and that said automobile yet remains the property of the estate of Lieut. Snell.

If the title papers disclose that Lieut. Snell transferred title to Lt. Col. Cooper, and that title to the vehicle was in Lt. Col. Cooper on the date of Lieut. Snell's death, then Lt. Col. Cooper had the authority to transfer title to the car to Major Powell.
