UNCCC 25th Anniversary Celebration

You are invited to participate in the celebration of the 25th Anniversary of the UNC Computation Center. In August 1959, a UNIVAC 1105 was installed at UNC marking the beginning of general access to computers for research and education on the Chapel Hill campus. We would like to celebrate this anniversary by providing students, faculty, and staff with an opportunity to expand their knowledge of computers.

On August 29 and 30 (Wednesday and Thursday), from noon until 9 p.m. in the Great Hall of the Student Union, vendors will demonstrate a large variety of computing equipment including minicomputers, microcomputers, graphics workstations, and some high quality printers. Also on August 29 and 30, there will be a series of four presentations, as follows:

Dr. William Graves, Associate Dean of General Education and Professor of Mathematics at UNC, and Dr. William Thompson, Professor of Physics at UNC, will make presentations.

William Hanson, the Director of the Computation Center from 1963 until 1968, will discuss how the use of computers has changed since the days of the UNIVAC 1105.

- * The Information Explosion and Future of the Office
Ken Peet, IBM Executive Briefing Center in Texas, will make this presentation.
