Editor's note: I found the following undated ode, rolled up in an ancient, crumbling cylindrical aluminium cigar-case, off Chung Ying Street on an uncharted tidal sandbank in Starling Inlet (Sha Tau Kok Hui), while canoeing between the Colony of Hong Kong and the People's Republic of China on the stroke of midnight, 30 June 1997. Whether it is/was governed by the laws of British Hong Kong or of the Mainland of China is therefore a moot point. From internal evidence, and despite the virtually illegible signature, it is believed to have been penned by an eminent scholar of French literature.
