2. Although a thorough search of files was made, the following were not

located:

a. Letter of transmittal to War Department of SOP of November 5, 1941. The only written evidence that it might have been sent to the War Department was the interstaff routing slip which showed the date of publication as 8 November 1941. Apparently no record was kept because the SOP was classified only "Restricted." (Paragraph 1 j, basic.)

b. Colonel Berquist's report was not found. (Paragraph 1 k, basic.)
c. Memorandum of General Staff asking study of air situation in Hawaii was not found. However, what is believed to be a reply to this memorandum was found. (Paragraph 1 l, basic.)

d. Pattern of bombings by Japanese was not found. (Paragraph 1 m, basic.) e. Navy's estimates based on presence of carriers in Marshalls was not found;

at least none were found with any specific reference to these carriers. (Paragraph 1 r, basic.)
