1. Enclosure (A), which was furnished this office by the Military Intelligence Division, Hawaiian Department, is forwarded for information. The Federal Bureau of Investigation, Honolulu, also supplied this office with two copies of the same enclosure, one of which has been sent to the "Unit" at the Navy Yard, Pearl Harbor, and the other retained in the files of the District Intelligence Office.

2. The Federal Bureau of Investigation, Honolulu, recently furnished this office with three copies of the incoming despatch log of the Japanese Consulate General, Honolulu, one copy of which is transmitted herewith as enclosure (B), one copy of which has been sent to the Pearl Harbor "Unit", and one copy of

which is retained tin the files of the District Intelligence Office.

3. Before leaving Honolulu, the Japanese Consul General was given three alternatives in the matter of disposing of papers in his possession: (a) to take them with him; (b) to pack, seal, and store them here; or, (c) to throw them away. He elected to throw away a great deal of written matter, most of which was first torn into pieces. The material from which enclosures (A) and (B) were taken was found among the papers so thrown away and pieced together by translators attached to the Military Intelligence Division, the Federal Bureau of Investigation, and the District Intelligence Office.

4. The urgency of delivery of this letter and enclosures (A) and (B) is such that they will not reach the addressee in time by the next available officer courier. The originator therefore authorizes the transmission of this letter and enclosures (A) and (B) by registered mail to the continuental limits of the United States and

by registered airmail within the continental limits of the United States.

Subject: Anti-corpede haffles for protection against corpole plane attacks, Pearl Harber.

Consideration has been given to the installation of A/T buffer within Pearl Barbor for protection against torpedo plane attacks. It is considered that the relatively shallow depth of water limits the need for anti-torpedo sets to Pearl Harbor. In addition the conjection and the necessity for manufacturing room limit the practicability of the present type of toffice.

 Certain limitations and considerations are advised to be borne in mind in planning the installation of anti-torpedo traffics within huristic, among which

the fellowing many be considered:

(a) A minimum depth of trains of seventy-five feet may be assumed necessary to successfully drop tempolars from planes. One training and lifty feet of water is desired. The maximum beight planes at present experimentally drop tempolars is 250 feet. Launching speeds are between 120 and 150 levels. Desirable height for stregging is sixty feet or less. About two hundred yards of torpedo run is necessary before the exploding series is armed, but this may be altered.

(b) There should be emple maneuvering mean available for vestels approach-

ing and leaving bevtlas.

(c) Ships should be able to get away on abort notice.

(d) Heers must be available inside the builter for tugs, fuel oil barges and harbor craft to memoryer abouguide individual ships.

(c) Butter should be clear of coble areas, forcy routes, and channels used by

apriquids.

(f) finding should be smilletent distance from unchored vessels to insure the results' sufety in case a torpedo explodes on striking a bullle.

(g) High lami in the vicinity of an unchorage makes a successful aisplane attack from the lami side most difficult.
(b) Vulnerable areas in the builts should be so placed as to compel attacking
