Cultural Literacy Enrichment Monday –Thursday 3:00 pm – 4:00 pm

Group A: Students Age 5–8 Group B: Students Age 9–12

This program component assists children in building reading,

comprehension, and critical thinking skills. Using fundamental concepts, literacy counselors use tools to build self-esteem and awareness in children that will expand their vocabulary, improve grammatical skills, and increase analytical abilities in reading and writing.

Homework Assistance Monday – Thursday 4:00 pm – 5:00 pm

Group A: Students Age 5–8 Math/Science Review Group B: Students Age 5–8 Language Arts/Social Studies Review Group C: Students Age 9–12 Math/Science Review Group D: Students Age 9–12 Language Arts/Social Studies Review Homework assistance provides ongoing academic support through active tutoring and strong mentorship. Students also work to improve their computer skills and participate in educational enrichment games.

In Our Voices Teen Outreach Tuesday and Thursday 4:00 pm – 6:00 pm

Teen students age 13–18 focus on academic enrichment, career planning and life skills building. Production of the program's magazine, In Our Voices: A Youth Review of the Arts and Humanities provides students with a structured introduction to the arts and humanities. Participants attend cultural and educational events throughout the Triangle area and publish review essays chronicling their experiences.
