



WHICH THEY HAD ENTIRELY DE-VARIATED, AND SKIPPED IN A DOJEK DIRECTIONS TO THE RESIDENCE PORTIONS, AS NIGHT PELL THRY HAD MADE THEIR WAY OVER INTO THE NORTH, SEACH, SECTION, AND SPRINGING ANDW TO THE SOUTH THEY REACHED OUT ALONG THE SHIPPING SECTION DOWN THE BAY SHORE, OVER THE HILLS AND ACROSS TOWARD THIRD AND TOWNSEND STREETS. IT IS ESTIMATED THAT THE LOSS IN SAN PRANCISCO WILL REACH FROM \$150,000,000 TO \$200,000,000. THESE PIGURES ARE IN THE ROUGH AND NOTHING CAN BE TOLD UNTIL HARTIAL ACCOUNTING IS TAKEN.

ON EVERY SIDE THERE WAS DRATH AND SUPPRRING VESTERDAY. HUNDREDS WERE INJURED, RITHR BURNED, CRUSHED OR STRUCK BY FALLING PIECES FROM THE BUILD-INC. AND ONE OF TEN DITO WHILE ON THE OPOFERATING TABLE AT MECHANICS PAVILION, INDROVISED AS A ROSPITAL FOR THE COMPORT AND CARE OF THE INSURED. 

HOMELESS ONES FLOCK ACROSS BAY

Men and Women, Rich and Poer, Old and Young, Unfortunates Who Have Suffered the Tortures of Hell Crowding the Streets of Aristocratic Oakland

........

OAKLAND, April 19 .- The streets of Oakland tonight are througed. Fifty thousand people are here already and every boat that lands here brings its crowds.

There is nothing left undone to make the refugees as comfortable as possible and every house that has a room or nook to spare is opened wide

On the doorways of houses people sink down in sleep when once they realize that they are safe. The parks are crowded and tents have spring up like mushrooms. People of all nations are assembled here and every effort is being made that looks toward their comfort.

The water front is crowded. There are many who, since coming here, have found: their loved ones missing and they besiege each boat that leaves for the destroyed city for pas-

The work of rescue goes on with unabated: zeal. No thought of ceasing is contemplated until the last man or woman has been taken from the markstrom that rages across the bay.

The water front here is bare, seared clean by flames. The fires have died and families camp as best they can. There is constant shift of people to and fro. And there is hunger here, the hunger which makes weary women forget their weariness when they look at their children crying for bread.

Every place has its wreckage. Clothing of all sorts, and all the smaller household furnishings, is strewn around. Every place that makes a shelter for a man or woman is occupied. The houses are all filled.

Up the streets that lead from the Oakland Mole are processions that warder on and on; not knowing where they got not caring where they go, but crying for a relief from peril that has palled them for two days.

Wagons of all sorts are pressed into service. Chinese fairly swarm, making for the open. not caring where they go except that it be in the fields where there are trees instead of smoldering ruins



We are pleased to announce a <u>new release of the CDNC newspaper viewer</u>. The beta version formerly available for searching the Daily Alta California was taken down. The Alta California will return as quickly as we can load the data. All titles will be searchable from one database.

The <u>Center for Bibliographical Studies and Research</u>, <u>University of California</u>, <u>Riverside (UCR)</u>, has received two grants from the <u>National Endowment for the Humanities</u> to participate in the <u>National Digital Newspaper Program (NDNP)</u>, 2005-2009. Additional information about this program is available at the <u>Library of Congress</u> corollary <u>NDNP</u> Web site. We also received three Library Services and Technology Act grants from the <u>California State Library</u> to create a California Digital Newspaper Collection at UCR.

The NDNP is a joint venture of the National Endowment for the Humanities and the Library of Congress to create a national digital newspaper resource representing papers from all states published between 1836-1922. The program is projected to last twenty years. The first grant covered newspapers published between 1900-1910. The Center digitized over 100,000 pages of California newspapers for this period: the San Francisco Call, the Amador Ledger, the Imperial Valley Press, and the Los Angeles Herald. The Center will be digitizing an additional 100,000 pages for the second grant, which targets newspapers published 1880-1910.

The California Digital Newspaper Collection at UCR will include all papers digitized for the national program and additional historical California newspapers, the Daily Alta California, in particular.
