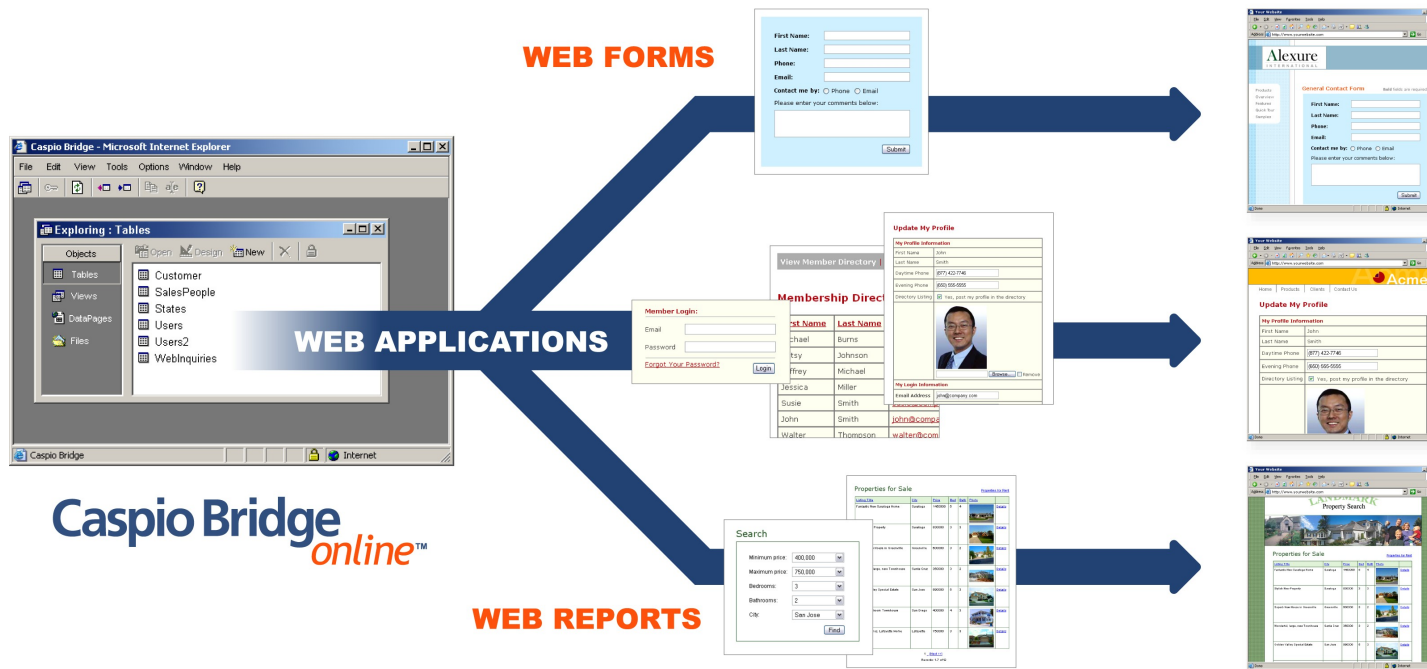

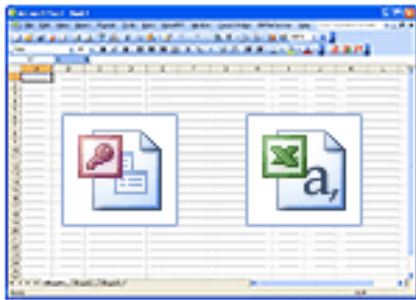

Photo enforcement loophole dismisses 1 in 5 tickets

Where are the Valley's photo enforcement cameras? Search and map with the database below.

Roughly one in five photo enforcement citations are dismissed because of a legal loophole.

The ABC15 Investigators combed through more than 300,000 citations from Phoenix, Mesa, and Scottsdale, and found a large number of cases thrown out because the tickets were not properly served.

Sometimes, cameras make mistakes.

It happened to us when our producer got a speeding ticket, but because the ticket was issued to the wrong vehicle in the picture we were cleared.

Most often, though, people get out of a ticket through a huge legal loophole in Arizona, one that requires photo enforcement tickets to be personally served.

The information collected by the FBI is broken up by violent and property crimes. Violent crimes are murder, forcible rape, robbery and aggravated assault. Property crimes are burglary, larceny theft, motor vehicle theft and arson. The 2006 population figures are FBI estimates, based on preliminary data from the U.S. Census.



Relative Paths in Destination Page Redirection

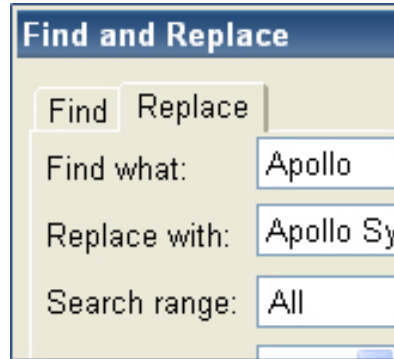



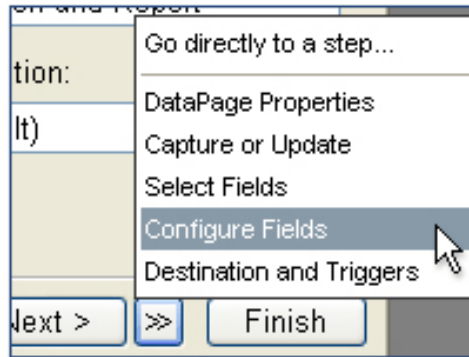
