SUBJECT: R-ASTR-NG support for Guidance Backup Studies

1. I propose that this branch study the following areas to support guidance backup:

- a. Determination of switchover criteria that will cause the guidance failure light to light.
- b. Investigation of alternate guidance implementation schemes and alternate attitude generation schemes. Consideration will be given to using spacecraft guidance and control equipment. Both man-in-the-loop and not using the man will be considered.
- 2. I assume that R-ASTR-F will perform the following tasks with their GE-235 computer and astronaut cockpit simulator (under development): determination of control stability, accuracy, performance, and switchover transients. This will be for switchover occurring during boost or a decision made to switchover while in orbit.
- 3. I propose that R-AERO study development of switchover criteria that require decisions to be made based on ground display information, e. g. so-called "slow failures." R-ASTR-NG would be consulted and concur in all recommendations based on or affecting G&C hardware failures.
