The Mirror Front Panel is hold in place in the CEM Lower EC-Volume by eight bolts (four against the bottom, four against the wall, see figure 16).

Unfasten (four) launch fixations bolts and (two) lower mounting screws (4 mm Hex Head Driver, 1/4" drive; Ratchet Wrench, 1/4" drive; 10" extension,1/4" drive).
