Significant Changes Since Design Baseline

- Launch date changed from 9/16/10 to 11/01/10
- Mission duration increased from 8+1+2 to 11+1+2 and EVAs increased from 0/1 to 2/1(scheduled/unscheduled)
- Maximum rendezvous altitude decreased from 200 N. Mi. to 190 N. Mi.
- Incorporated multi-stage deorbit for contingency payload return cases
- MPS budget updated from R0901S to R1005S
- Significant mass property changes
 - Addition of hardware for LWAPA return
 - Addition of Port TSA
 - Increase OMS loading from standard (22,761 lbm.) to near-full (24,860 lbm.)
 - Middeck weight increased
 - PMM weight decreased



Significant Mission Firsts and Unique Items

- Budgeted propellant to protect for Passive Thermal Control (PTC)
- First flight of DOLILU Block Update 2010.02 (S052550PM)
 - First flight of MPS Budget R1005S (S084799AY)
 - First flight of DOLILU assessment of in-plane launch time
 - Minor updates to discipline scripts
 - Updates approved at SICB OAR (9/14/10)
- Per program direction, design does not protect for absolute "worst-case forward" scenario where PMM deployed with ELC-4 still in payload bay
 - Flight Rule ULF5_C2-85 in place documenting rationale that if ELC-4 not deployed, PMM will also not be deployed.

Special Topics

SMS AR 097938 Unconverged Ascent Guidance

- ADI needles stowed continuously for 38 seconds after MM-103 transition during RTLS case for STS-133 ascent stand-alone crew training
 - The crew interpreted the longer duration of ADI attitude error needle stowage as continuous PEG unconvergence and responded with attempt to take CSS and engage BFS.
 - Confirmed that an unconverged PEG response to MM103 transition and nominal OMS Assist can cause ADI needle stowage of 10 16 seconds (typical).
 - ADI error needle stowage could extend up to 38 sec due to occasional PEG unconvergence spikes (uncommon).
 - During continuous period of ADI needle stowage that results from occasional unconvergence spikes, PEG is predominantly converged with a good guidance solution and allows steering when converged.
 - Audit concluded FSW operating per Level B/C requirements.
 - Corresponding evaluation by A/E Crew Training and GPO offices concluded with plan to adjust Crew / Flight Controller Training and increase situational awareness for cases of suspected non-converged guidance.
 - Final results were presented to the NASA Flight Software Office, A/E Flight Techniques Panel, and SICB Chair.

Special ADFD Assessment

- Significant mass property and propellant quantity changes occurred after I-Load design necessitating a special assessment to identify impacts.
- Determined that all necessary changes can be incorporated in Uplink cycle and standard close-to-launch product deliveries



Special Topics - continued

Projected Ascent Performance (APM) Margin below guidelines

- Flight Manager reserve is 400 lbs APM at open of launch window (not including 700 lbs DOL reserve)
- APM based on FRR TDDP is 203 lbs at open of a 5 minute window
- Current projection is approximately -30 lbs (IPT projection)
- Additional threats exist
- SSP/MOD evaluating what get wells are available to mitigate issue

Dryden Radar (FDRC) Tracking Test

- Currently down for maintenance, expected to resume service on 9/20/10
- Testing and evaluation planned prior to STS-133 mission.



Special Topics - concluded

Radar Support

- Antigua scheduled to be closed on October 1st.
- Kwajalein (KWAJ) C-band and White Sands Missile Range (WMSR) data scheduled to be unavailable due to Information Assurance (IA) policy issues.
- DM has requested a waiver extension for KWAJ.
 - If waiver not in place data would be received with significant time delay.
 - No significant impact to potential loss of KWAJ data.
- WSMR work-around allows receipt of data from WSMR sites regardless of IA.
 - Validation test of WSMR Software Version 10.3 supported by JSC Navigation on June 24, 2010 which verified GMT day rollover fix and IA procedural work-around. Test validated the software for SSP tracking support
 - No issues with WSMR landing

FDOC Software Transition

- Final part of FDD discipline software transferred to FDOC control on 9/03/10.
- During STS-133 design, FDD retained responsibility for some discipline software maintenance
- Continue to support FDOC capture and release of DOL script updates for DOLILU Block Update

ISS Phasing Strategy

- Two ISS Reboosts prior to STS-133 set up phasing for STS-133, 22S landing, and 24S launch
 - 9/15: Completed 4.1 ft/s (1.25 m/s)
 - 10/16: Planned 3.8 ft/s (1.15 m/s)
- Rendezvous altitude will be approximately 190 nm.
- FD3 rendezvous from 11/1 11/7
 - For a launch on 11/7, beta constraint would be violated if extension day added to mission
- Beta cutout 11/8 11/23 and 1/5 1/22
- Window open on small phase angle days limited by minimum of about 37 deg.

Mated Reboost

• Mated reboost is not scheduled, however, if propellant is available, reboost could be used to optimize future vehicle phasing without using Russian propellant.
