- 1.1 The flight version of Star Charts is fabricated with polar projections (page 1-4) on the back of the rectangular projection (page 1-3). Flight charts are produced with white overprint on a black background. A photograph of Star Charts in flight configuration is shown on page 1-2.
- 1.2 The rectangular chart is a Mean of 1950 (M50) mercator projection with coverage extending from the equator to 65° north and 70° south declination. Each polar projection covers the entire hemisphere. Both right ascension and declination are expressed in degrees. The charts depict 1466 stars, ranging in magnitude from -1 to +4. The first 50 nav stars are circled, named, and numbered, and the second 50 nav stars are circled and numbered. The ecliptic plane is indicated on the charts, as are the Milky Way and the large and small Magellanic clouds.
- 1.3 The baseline rectangular Star Chart is annotated for each specific flight by the addition of the Sun and planets (Venus, Mars, Jupiter, and Saturn) in their launch date positions. Moon symbols that show the various phases (new, first quarter, full, last quarter) are added for each day of the mission. Moon symbols are identified by calendar day starting at GMT.

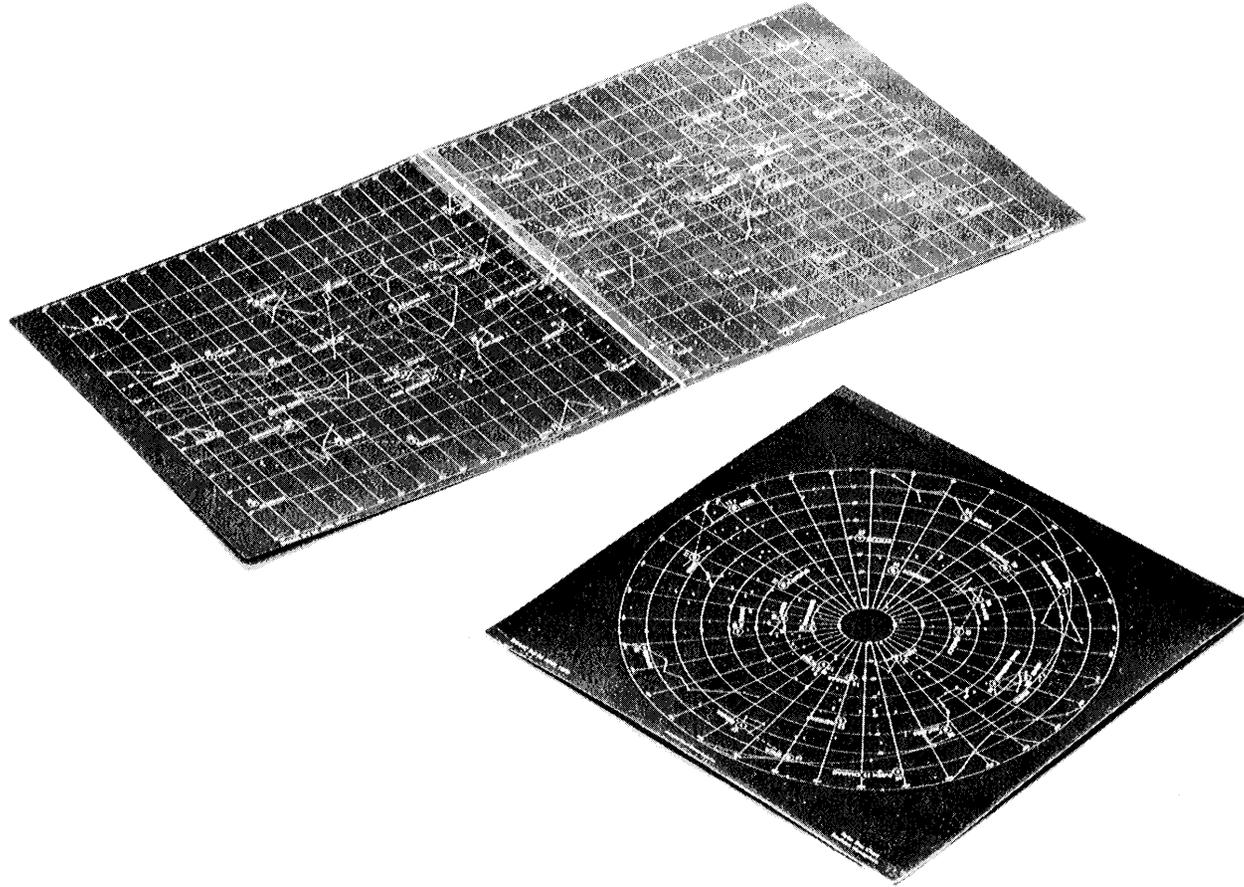


Figure 1-1.- Flight configuration Star Charts

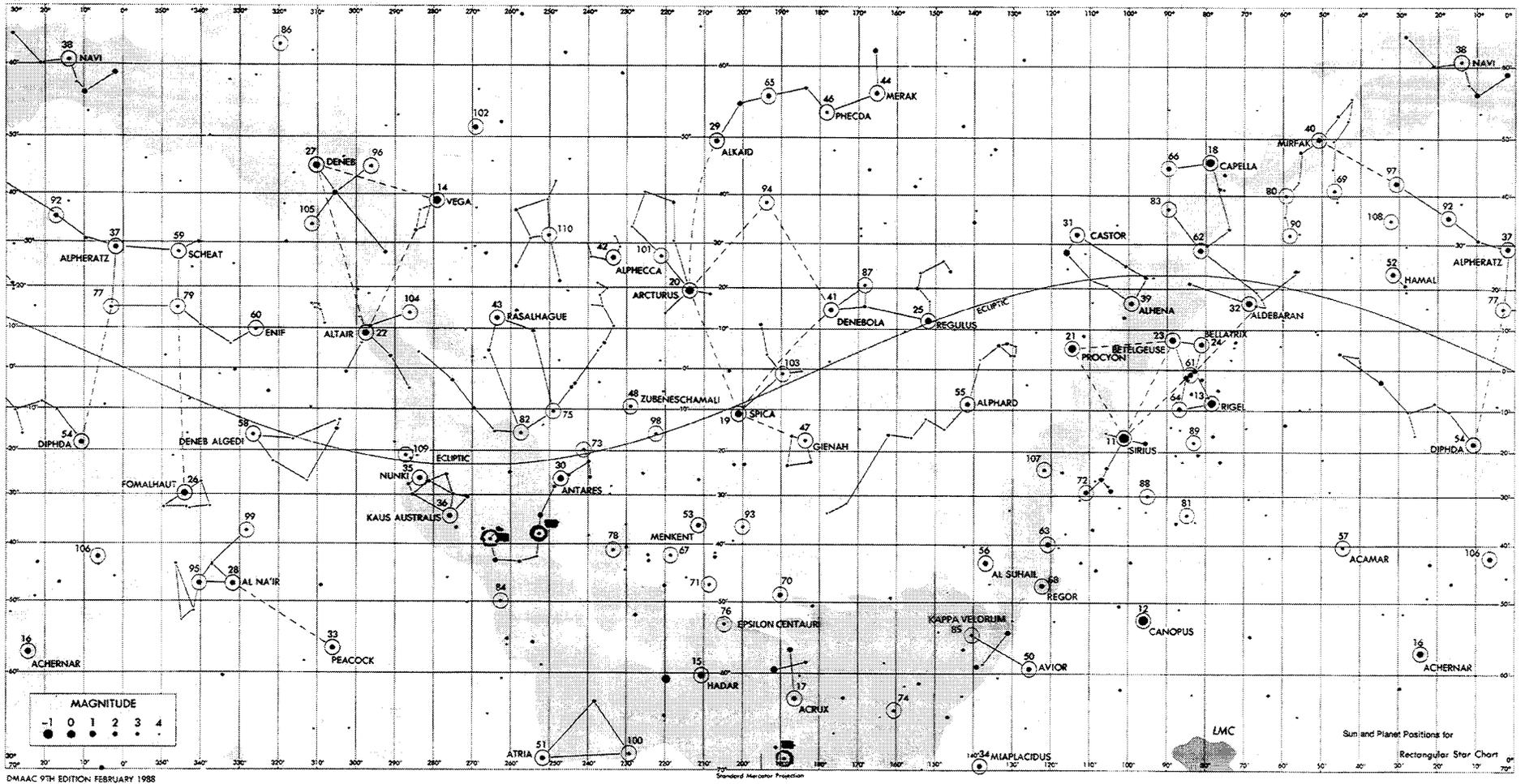
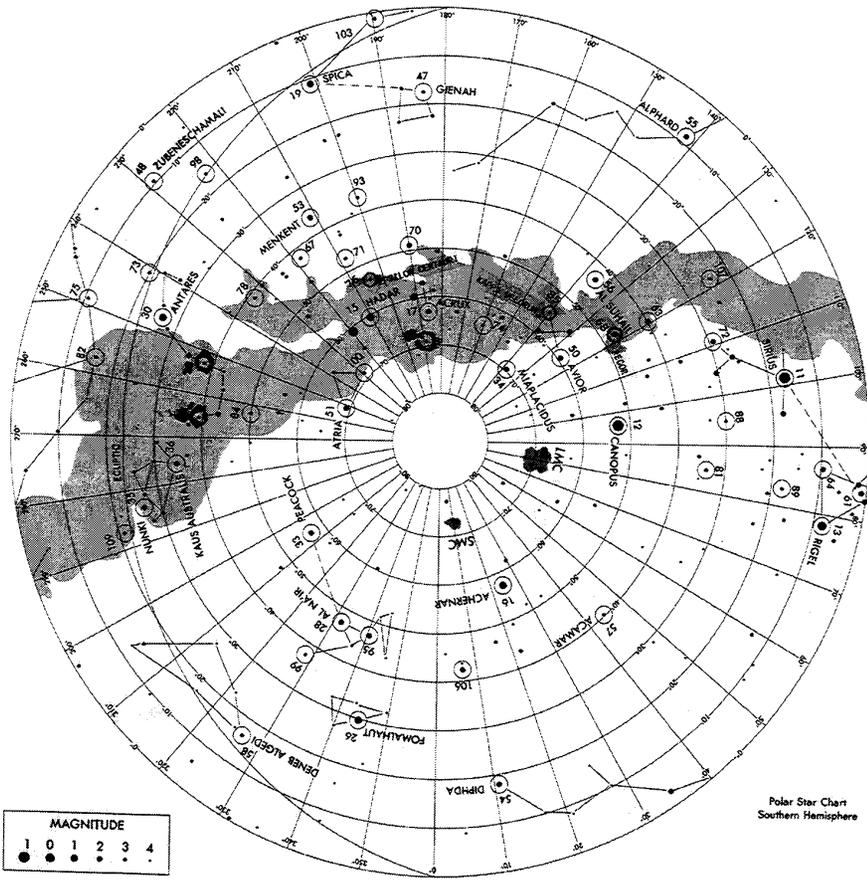
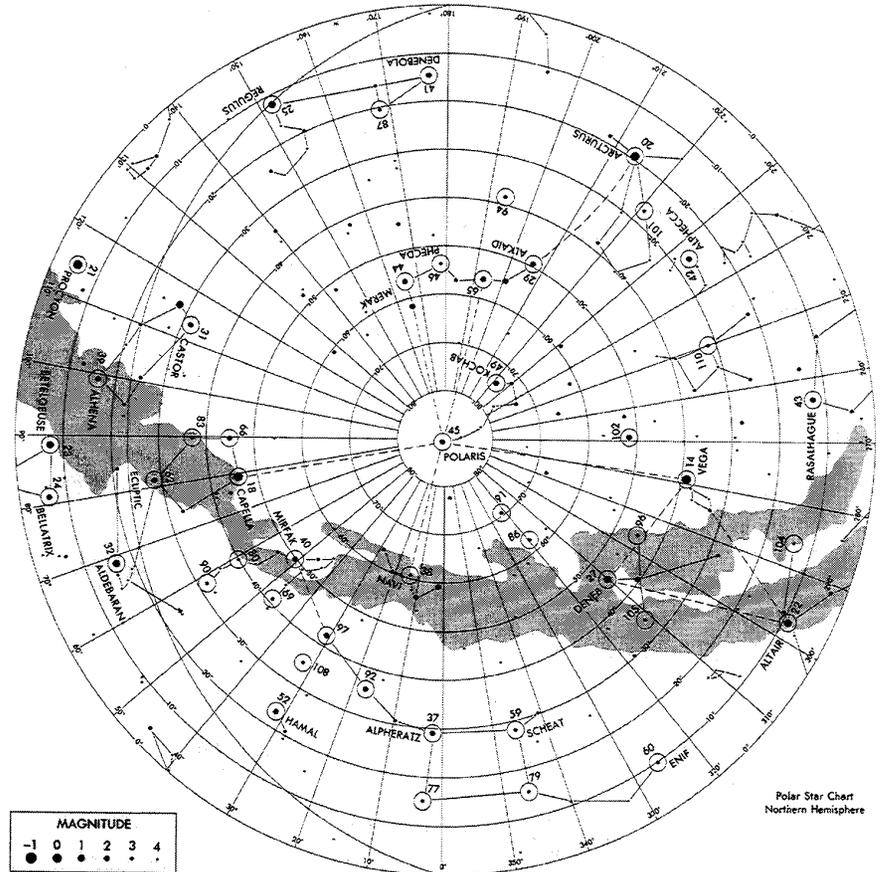


Figure 1-2.- Typical Star Chart (reverse angle)

- A. The flight version Orbit Map is produced in color at a scale of 1:52 million. The flight map is mounted in a frame with a groundtrack overlay. The map shown on page 2-4 is a reduced copy. An Orbit Map with overlay (flight configuration) is shown on page 2-5.
 - B. The overlay shows the groundtrack for three consecutive orbits and can be set to any desired ascending node. The overlay has time ticks at 1-min intervals along the groundtrack, with elapsed time callouts every 10 min. Elapsed time is measured from the initial ascending node. The overlay includes a map update block for recording MET and longitude of node for any given orbit.
 - C. The flight Orbit Map shows station coverage of STDN sites and TDRSS for the primary orbital altitude of each mission. Also shown are 750-nmi radius crossrange circles for shuttle landing sites and the South Atlantic Anomaly at the primary orbital altitude of each mission.
 - D. The baseline Orbit Map is annotated for each mission by adding photo targets, visual observation sites, or other areas of scientific or technical interest. When applicable, these subjects are documented as tabular listings and included with the flight crew World Atlas.

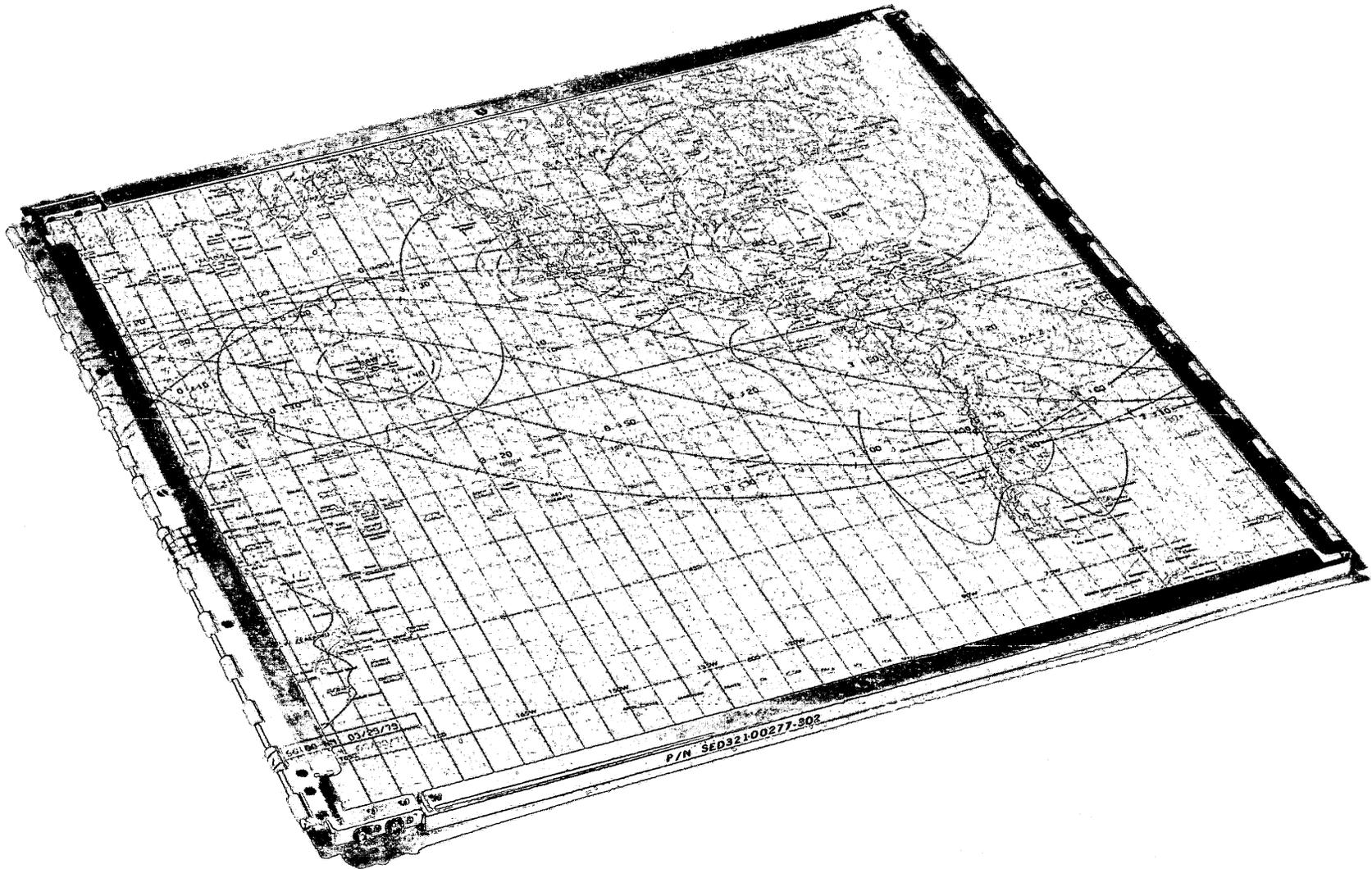
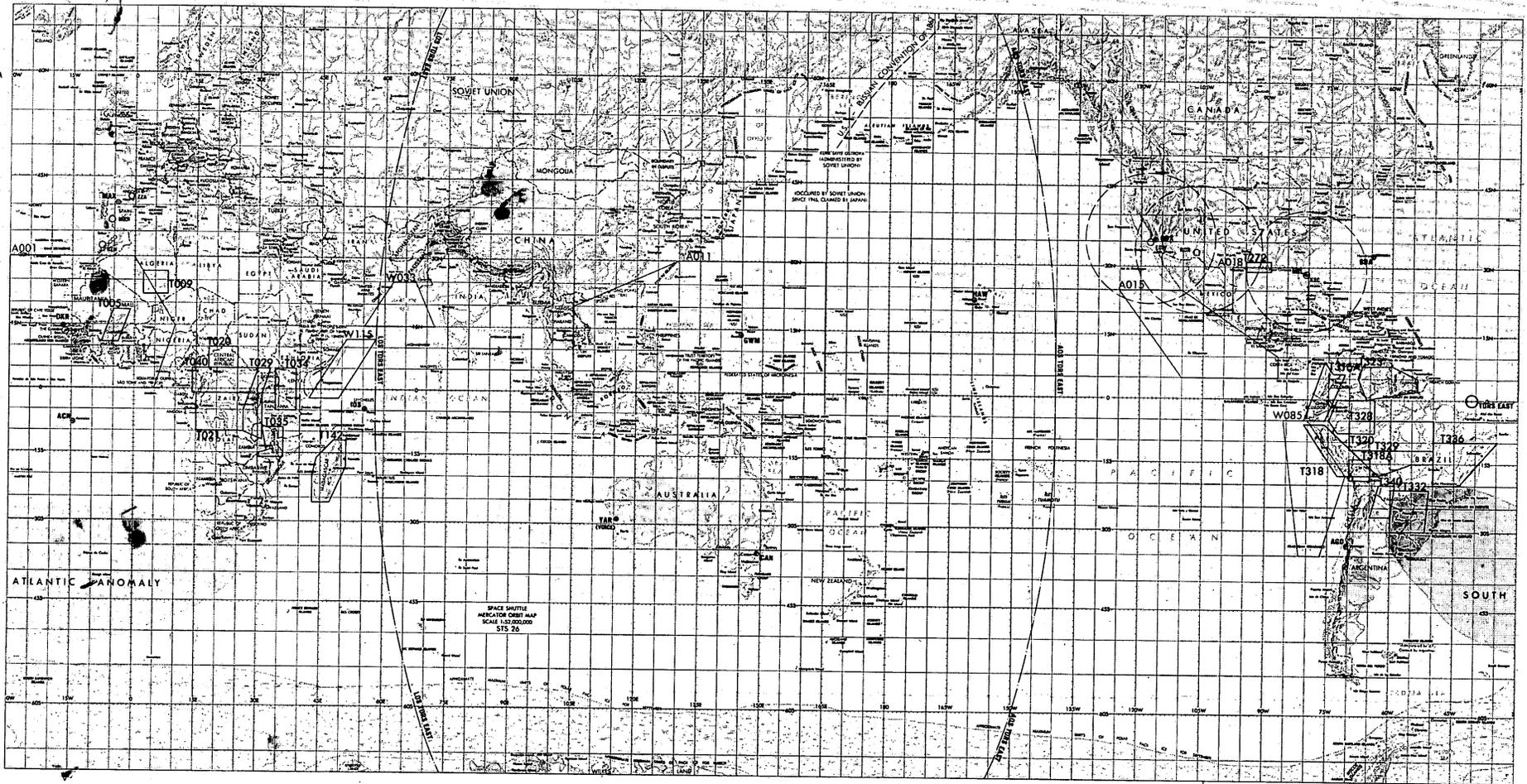


Figure 2-1.- Flight configuration Orbit Map

- 3.1 Landing Site Charts contain topographical information on designated shuttle landing sites. Flight versions are produced in color at the same size and scale as shown in this document.

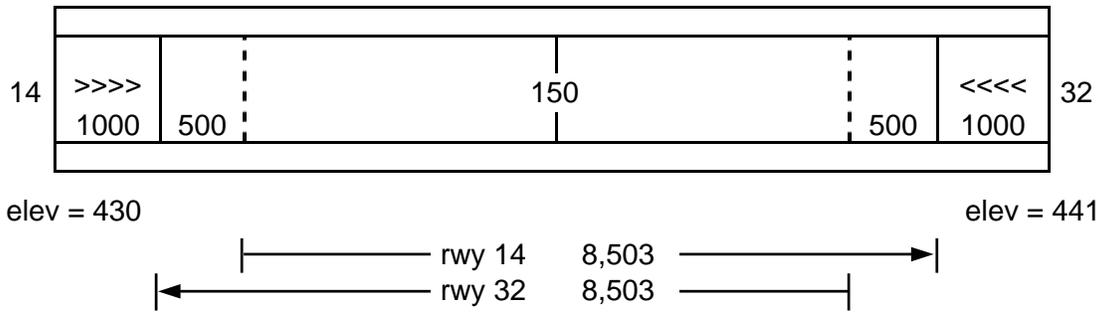

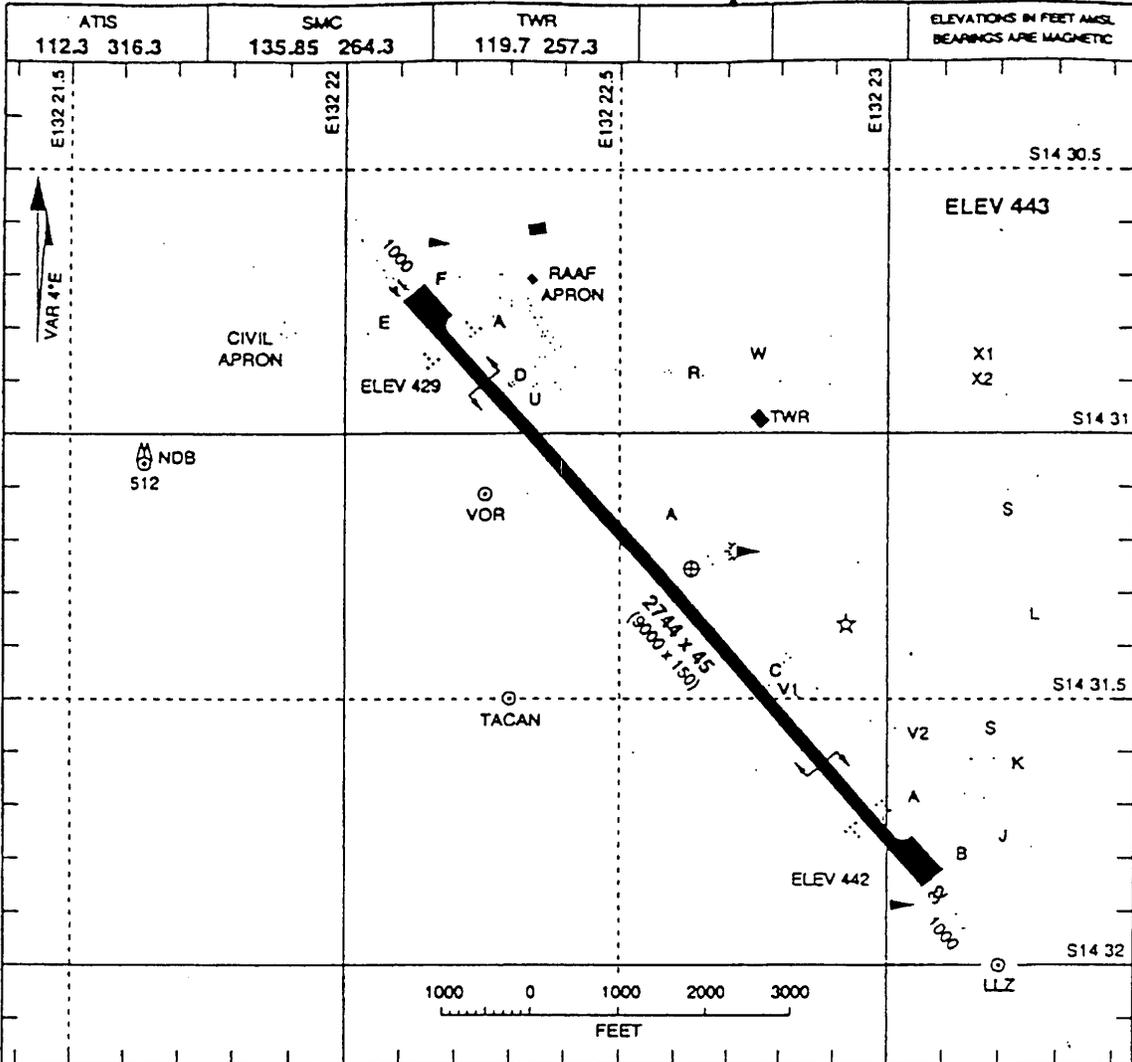

1. OVERSEAS AUGMENTED LANDING SITES

Augmented Landing Sites are those with landing aids and NASA personnel in place during missions. These include prime and backup TAL sites.

- a. GOM or convoy ops rep will advise the crew on UHF 259.7. Be prepared to evacuate to a distance of 1250 ft. The crew is expected to open the hatch.
- b. The Commander will turn over responsibility for the orbiter to the GOM.
- c. The flight crew will brief the GOM on orbiter status.
- d. Approximately 90 minutes after landing, an MRT teleconference will be held to report the condition of the orbiter. Arrangements will then be made for the crew to speak with their families.
- e. All media requests for the crew will be coordinated through FCOD.
- f. The DOD will be responsible for initial treatment and transport of injured crewmembers. Uninjured crewmembers may be transported to Rota, Spain to wait for the arrival of the JSC crew return aircraft. The local FCOD rep may go with the flight crew.
- g. The JSC crew return aircraft will arrive approximately 16 hr after landing to transport the crew to Houston. The FCOD representative will carry flight crew passports.
- h. Personnel on the crew return aircraft will include, but are not limited to:
 - JSC FCOD Director and/or his representative(s)
 - JSC Flight Surgeon
 - JSC PAO representative
 - KSC security representative
- i. The KSC GOM may advise the commander that the flight crew or TALCOM can approach the orbiter. The flight crew may then enter the orbiter and retrieve clean clothes and other needed articles. The flight crew should also retrieve return-to-Houston items at this time.
- j. NASA personnel should aid the flight crew in retrieving early return items to be transported with the flight crew.
- k. The flight crew will brief the Rapid Response Team and Mishap Investigation Team via telecon from either the landing site or evacuation site.
- l. After the crew departs, the GOM assumes responsibility for the orbiter. The side hatch will be closed as soon as possible.
- m. For further information, see the Emergency Landing Site guidelines.

2. BASES WITH U.S. MILITARY PRESENCE AND NO NASA PERSONNEL

These guidelines are only deltas to instructions for Emergency Landing Sites. Please refer to them for full instructions.

- a. Evacuate the orbiter and turn it over to the U.S. senior military official who will be responsible for the orbiter until arrival of the Rapid Response Team. The Commander will designate a crewmember to assist the DOD senior official in safing and safeguarding the orbiter until crew departure.
- b. The flight crew will be escorted to a facility to contact MCC. There will be a teleconference approximately 90 minutes after landing.
- c. The flight crew will be escorted to appropriate facilities to await arrival of the Crew Recovery Team. Meals should be available.
- d. The U.S. military will assume responsibility for treatment of injured flight crewmembers.
- e. All media requests for the crew will be coordinated through FCOD.
- f. DOD has trained the emergency and rescue forces providing them with a functional knowledge of contingency response force procedures and orbiter hazards and precautions.
- g. The JSC crew return aircraft will be dispatched to pick up the flight crew. Estimated arrival time is 16 hr.

3. EMERGENCY LANDING SITES

The following are guidelines for landings at sites without NASA augmentation or U.S. military presence.

- a. MCC should have communications with the tower. If not, contact the tower on UHF guard 243.0. Nonmilitary sites may have only VHF capability; contact on PRC-112 on VHF guard 121.5 after landing.
- b. Evacuate to a distance of 1250 ft (with visor down and locked, and emergency oxygen bottle activated). Beware of toxic fumes and burning tires. Notify the tower that only firefighting personnel should approach the orbiter.
- c. A DOD MEDEVAC aircraft and medical team will be dispatched to the landing site as soon as possible. The crew return aircraft may be first to arrive.
- d. The Commander will retain responsibility for the flight crew and orbiter until relieved by competent NASA, DOD, or State Department officials.
- e. The Commander will meet with local airfield officials and give them prepared onboard orbiter emergency guidelines (see U.S. EMBASSY, p. 4-7). The commander will briefly advise them on vehicle hazards and safety requirements and inform them that towing should not be attempted. A U.S. embassy representative will arrive at the airfield as soon as possible to assist local officials.
- f. The Commander will arrange with local officials to provide 24-hr security for the flight crew and orbiter. If a U.S. facility is nearby, these security forces would include at least one U.S. Government representative. The controlled access area should be a 1250-ft radius around the orbiter with a single entry point. The Commander will designate a crewmember to remain with the orbiter until a U.S. Government representative arrives.
- g. The Commander should designate a crewmember to maintain a log. The Commander should note local landing time and any pertinent observations of the orbiter and sequence of events leading up to the landing.
- h. The flight crew will establish communications with MCC CAPCOM as soon as possible. Phone numbers are listed on page 4-9.
- i. All media requests for the crew will be coordinated through FCOD.
- j. If there is a local U.S. facility, the flight crew may be escorted there to await transportation to the nearest U.S. military base.
- k. The Rapid Response Team will arrive in ~ 25 hr depending upon location and mission phase. On-orbit response may take longer. Personnel will include, but are not limited to:

KSC Rapid Response Team Commander
KSC GOM/Vehicle Manager
KSC Tow Team
KSC Logistics Team
JSC FCOD representative
Mishap Investigation Team
Payload representative
DDMS representative
KSC Security Team

- l. The JSC crew return aircraft will be deployed to pick up the flight crew at their evacuation location. Estimated time of arrival is landing plus 16 hr. Flight crew passports will be carried onboard by the FCOD representative.
- m. The flight crew will brief the Rapid Response Team and Mishap Investigation Team via telecon as reqd from the landing site and evacuation site, as needed.
- n. The flight crew shall brief an FCOD or Rapid Response Team representative on locations of early return items to be removed from the orbiter for return to JSC if they are unable to retrieve them before evacuation.

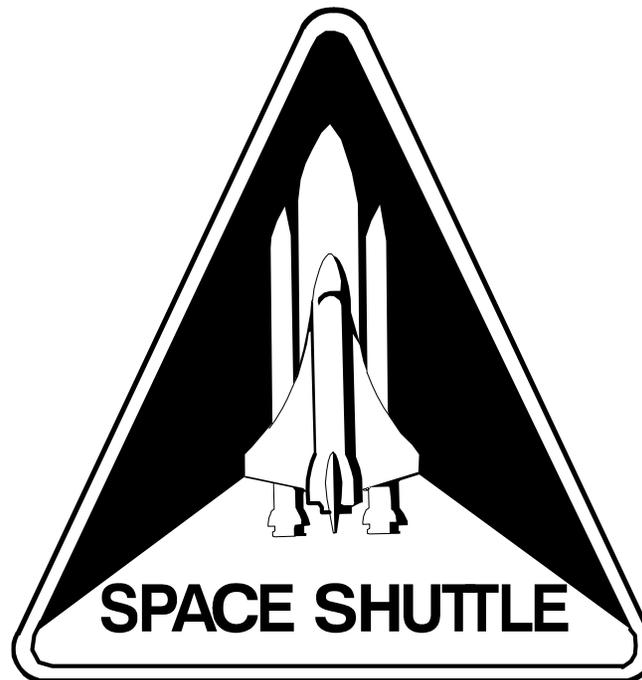
4. GUIDELINES FOR U.S. EMBASSY AND LOCAL AIRFIELD OFFICIALS

- a. When medical attention is required for the flight crew, a U.S. Government representative should remain in contact with the injured crewmember(s), if possible. NASA will arrange with DOD to evacuate both injured and uninjured personnel to the nearest U.S. military base.
- b. The flight crew will be retrieved by the JSC crew return aircraft from their evacuation location.
- c. Due to the nature of hazards present, no one should approach within 1250 ft (400 m) of the orbiter. The vehicle is considered hazardous until declared safe by appropriate safety personnel.
- d. Contact the MCC, NASA, JSC, Houston, Texas, USA. Phone numbers are listed on page 4-9. Dispatch a U.S. Government representative, if available, to the landing site.
- e. Provide interpreters if needed and available.
- f. Provide escorts, transportation, lodging, and meals as necessary for the flight crew until they are evacuated.
- g. The NASA Rapid Response Team will arrive in approximately 25 hr, depending upon landing location. Personnel will include NASA management, orbiter tow team, security, Mishap Investigation Team, DOD and an Astronaut Office representative.
- h. The flight crew will not meet with media representatives. A flight crew statement will be released from JSC PAO.
- i. Contract a photographer to be escorted to safe areas to take photos of the orbiter, any debris, and anything else that appears out of the ordinary (e.g., fire, smoke, fumes). The exposed film will be purchased by NASA and should not be developed.
- j. If any damage occurs to the orbiter, debris should be left in its place with documentary photographs and location descriptions taken. To preclude injury or disturbance of the scene, debris should not be handled. Avoid debris having a fishy/ammonia, pungent/sweetish, or ammonia-like smell. Seek immediate medical attention for irritation to the nose, throat, or eyes, or coughing and difficulty breathing. The area should be secured to a 1250-ft radius to prevent sightseers from disturbing the scene or picking anything up.
- k. Record any pertinent observations with time indices.
- l. Arrange to have witnesses contacted. Obtain their names, addresses, and telephone numbers.
- m. The orbiter should not be towed without Mishap Investigation Team approval. The orbiter cannot be safely moved without special equipment, therefore towing is discouraged. Contact NASA KSC for further information if the airfield officials insist.

- n. The flight crew commander is responsible for the orbiter and flight crew. It will be necessary for him or her to stay in contact with NASA Mission Control Center in Houston, Texas. Please assist the commander in any way possible.
