



and instructions were issued on the proper methods of correspondence in all its phases. The results obtained were satisfactory.







SUPPLY

This organizations supply history in my estimation is a history of supply on Drew Field. It is a story of a new army base trying to operate efficiently with limited help and limited space. An example of this is post, camp, and station property, which in the summer and fall of 1942 was issued on any officer's signature. This situation has been corrected through the installation of adequate office help, on the part of the variour supply branches. Because of the added help the branches of supply have been able to initiate a system where the battalian S-4's signature is the only accepted signature at each branch. The S-4 in turn may authorize others to sign for property for which he accepts responsibility. This system which is now running smoothly and efficiently makes it easy for any interested party to find out what property, and in what amount, is in the battalion at any time.

The other notable improvement in facilitating supply procedure was the reorganization of the battalion under Table of Organization and Equipment 11-400. This reorganization authorized a battalion 8-4 for the first time, and this authorization in turn allowed for a closer check being kept on property shipped into the battalion. Under the old Table of Organization 11-445, 11-446, etc., equipment was constantly being shipped direct to companies within the battalion. This again caused a lack of knowledge on the part of any individual, to know what organizational equipment was in the battalion at all times. Consolidated reports on equipment were therefore frequently submitted late, as counts on the items of equipment reported had to be taken before the report could be submitted; otherwise incorrect totals would be constantly reported. With the aforement oned Table of Organization and Equipment 11-400; however this situation

has been corrected.

I ADMINISTRATION AND PERSONNEL

The administration of this Battalion from Jan.1, 1943 to Oct.1, 1943 was for the most part, very routine. We did however have a large turn over in personnel which will be outlined in a later paragraph.

January 1, 1943 saw Major Raymond E. Morang as the Commanding Officer. Under his leadership the Battalion helped to train new men for other units. At no time during the first few months of the year, was an attempt made to bring the Battalion up to full T/O strength.

On March 19, 1943 the Battalion moved to a Site near Myakka State Park, about 18 miles East of Sarasota, Fla. This Site was called Camp Martin. We enjoyed life very much at Camp Martin. There were several other organizations at the Camp with us and in all there were about two-thousand men and Officers at the Camp.

While we were in the Camp, the 564th Sig AW Bn was re-organized The date was April 10, 1943. The 564th was now under T/O 11-400.

We were ordered back to Drew Field on April 20 and immediately prepared for Operational Training. The 564th Signal AW Battalion was composed of the following: one Headquarters and Plotting Company Two Reporting Companies one Ground Observer Company.

The 564th left Drew Field for OT on May 9, 1943/ We were located at the West Information Center, about one mile from Drew Field, until May 17. On May 18 the Bn HQ was located near Bartow, Fla. Reporting Platoons were located as follows:

At This time Major Fred M. Steigman became the Bn Commander and Major Morang was the Executive Officer.

On May 25th the Battalion moved to Dunedin, Fla., but moved back to Drew Field on May 28.

We stayed on Drew Field until July 2, 1943 when the Battalion moved to Largo Florida. We were on Drew Field again on July 15.

Major Steigman was transferred out of the organization and Major Morang was again the Commanding Officer.

Since July 15, 1943 to the date of October 1, 1943 there have been no radical chabges.

OPERATIONS AND TRAINING

During January 1, 1943 and October 1, 1943 numerous tactical situations were scheduled in which the Enlisted Men and Officers were taught the fundamentals 65 warfares which included, booby traps, foxholes, etc., the firing of all weapons and continued training in weekly road marches.

During the interim the organization scheduled and followed a weekly training program in accordance with a master schedule submitted by the 4th and 5th Signal - AW Training Battalions, under whose jurisdiction we were at that time.

SUPPLY

Battalion Supply for the 564th Signal AW Battalion was purely routine for most of the period between Janl, . 1943 and Oct. 1, 1943.

The most important phase of Supply work occured at the time of the reorganization under T/O 11-400 and the Operational Training Period.

Battalion Supply continually tried to see that the men were well clothed and well equiped as possible.





OPERATIONS AND TRAINING

On or about the 2 October 1943, the Battalion received orders for reorganization. Immediately, personnel with the proper specialist qualifications were transferred in to fill the vacancies created by the new Table of Organization. Personnel in excess of those required in particular SSN's were in turn transferred out except for about ten (10) per cent overage in officers.

Plans were made for processing and training personnel in preparation for Operational Training scheduled to start 1 November 1943. Processing was given first priority and was completed by 30 October 1943. Firing of the "C" Course on the .30 caliber rifle was scheduled next, and about ninety (90) percent completed before the end of the month.

Several well conducted Advanced Basic Training Courses were conducted by the 5th Signal AW Training Battalion for a group of men from each company to be used later as instructors in teaching the others in the organization. The courses were given in camouflage, truck driving, .50 caliber anticraft machine gun, Browning automatic rifle, and Infantry Tactics. All radio operators and radio repairmen were sent to the 5th Signal AW Training Battalion Radio School for a refresher course. Thirty-nine (39) of these radio operators had received no previous radio instruction; so they started the course by learning the code. A training program to cover the period from 1 November 1943 to 23 December 1943 was drawn up and distributed to all companies.



SUPPLY

During October 1943 this units reorganization caused a change in all companies supply personnel. All property books had to be cleared in order to ship the new authorized allowances to the newly designated companies. In this exchange all companies functioned smoothly and efficiently.

efficiently.

A showdown shortages inspection was held by the various branches of supply on the 27th and 28th of October. This inspection went off very well. All companies cooperated fully with the battalion S-4 and his assistants. Because of this cooperation we were commended by the Base S-4 Drew Field, for having the best showdown shortages inspection ever held on the base. Signal, Engineer, and Quartermaster, in particular, remarked on the manner of display, and the condition of the material inspected.







UNIT HISTORY

- 1. Reorganization was the first important incident that occured in the 564th Signal Aircraft Warning Battalion after its arrival in the European Theater of Operations. Letter, IX Fighter Command, dated 51 January 1944, Subj: "Reorganization of Certain Army Air Force Units", directed the reorganization and General Order #2, 564th Signal Aircraft Warning Battalion dated 15 February 1944 confirmed it and is herewith attached as a supporting document.
- 2. During this period of reorganization, the Battalion was assigned to the 54th Pighter Wing which had its headquarters located at Beaulieu, Hants., England. The 564th Signal Aircraft Warning Battalion was to furnish radar cover and airwarning service to the 64th Pighter Wing, whose duty it was to establish a Pighter Control system utilizing radar information from units assigned to their command. (Field Order #5 and Annex #1, Headquarters IX Air Support Command, dated 22 February 1944 is attached herewith as a supporting document.) In order to execute this plan it was necessary for the Battalion to train personnel and to requisition the equipment needed immediately.
- 3. Information Center and Radar personnel were placed in training at various RAF schools, and the natualion confucted a Truck drivers school and a radio school for operators and maintenance men.
- 4. Battalion supply continued to requisition equipment which was needed and by the end of February some of our TAT equipment began to arrive.
- 5. By 1 March 1944, it became quite apparent that the Battalion did not have sufficient equipment to operate at that time. Fresent training plans would not be completed before 22 April 1944 and therefore we would be unable to execute our duties as outlined in Par 2 above. Critical shortages included all Information Center equipment (AM/TR-1), all radio equipment and three (5) radar sets.
- 6. During the entire month of Earch 1944 our men were continually in training. We began receiving some radar, Information Center and radio equipment. Our total percentage of equipment on hand at the end of the month was seventy (70) per cent.
- 7. On 29 March 1344 we received a warning Order from the IX Air Support Command, alerting us for movement to Beaulieu, Mants., angland, the headquarters of the 84th Fighter wing. (letter, IX Air Support Command, Subj: "Movement Orders", dated 29 March 1864 is attached herewith as a supporting document.)

- 8. On 9 April 1944, the Battalion moved to Beaulieu, Hants., England. (Field Order #1, Hq. 564th Signal Aircraft Warning Battalion dated 7 April 1944 is attached herewith as a supporting document.)
- 9. The move to AAF Station 408 and outlying sitss was completed on April 9, 1944. No attempt at communications could be made until cool B, 12 April, due to radio silence. Intermittent communications were established with two sites during the morning of the 12th, but reliable communications were not possible with the present frequency assignments. For full scale operations the battalion was badly in need of additional radio equipment and frequencies. None of the special radio equipment authorized had been received, and of the twelve (12) SCR 188 sets received, six (6) had defective rectifiers and were undergoing repairs. Due to a shortage of replacement parts at the depot, no committment could be obtained as to the date these rectifiers would be available.
- 10. Detachment "A", 564th Signal Aircraft Varning Battalion consisting of one (1) officer and thirty one (51) enlisted men, comprising the Ground Observer Platoen, Company "B", was placed on Detached Service with the 563rd Signal Aircraft Warning Battalion effective April 14.
- 11. On 30 April 1944, the battalion was relieved from assignment to the IX Tactical Air Command and re-assigned to the IX air Defense Command. (General Orders #108 Headquarters Minth Air Force dated 20 April 1944 is attached herewith as a supporting locument.)
- 12. On 23 April, the battalion was alerted for movement to Church Penton, Yorkshire, ingland. (Field Order #3 & Field Order #4 headquarters 564th signal Aircraft warning Battalion are attached herewith as a supporting document). The move was accomplished with a forward and rear echelon. The forward echelon moved on 29 April.
- All platoons proceeded immediately to their outlying sites and contact was made by Radio immediately with all sites within twenty-four (24) hours.
- 14. Pursuant to instructions contained in Winth Air Force Ltr, deted 5 May 1944, Subject: "Alert Order No. 28" the battalion was alerted for movement to the "Far Shore".

- 15. Immediately we set about Marking all Vehicles, Clothing and equipment in accordance with instructions received from higher headquarters.
- 16. On June 26 "A" Echelon of the battalion moved to Wimbourne, ingland on the South Coast in preparation for movement to the "Far Shore" they were to wait in Wimbourne until such time as they were to proceed to the Marshalling Area.
- 17. On July 3, 1944, the second group of troops left Church Fenton for Bournemouth, ingland to await further movement to the marshalling Area and thence to the "Far Shore". The remainder of the battalion was still located at Church Fenton.
- 18. During the entire month of July the first and second echelons vaited on the South Coast for movement to the far shore. This comprised about one-quarter of the entire battalion. The remainder of the battalion was still located at Church Penton waiting for movement orders.
- 19. On 4 August 1944 the entire battalion assembled at Remenham, borks, England. All equipment was again checked, embarkation personnel rosters were brought up to date and the battalion was ready to hove on a moments notice.
- 20. On August 12, the entire battalion moved by rail and Lotor Convoy to the Marshalling area at Southampton, angland. Within twenty-four (24) hours the first echelon moved out by boat for the continent.
- 21 On 16 August the battalion was together again at "Chateau de Pepinvast", Le Vast, Manche, France. (Field Order #0 headquarters 504th Signal Aircraft Marning Battalion dated 20 August 44 is atached herewith as a supporting document.) The Filter Center was set up immediately and the various platoons and company headquarters proceeded to their designated sites.
- 22. On 28 August the battalion moved to Faviers, Aure-et-Lair, France and set up its Filter Center again. All sites took up new positions and made immediate contact with the Filter Center.
- 23. On 5 September the battalion moved again. This time to the vicinity of liberated Paris in the town of Czoir-La-Perviere, Seinest-Marne, France. All Radar sites took up new positions and the Filter Center was again put in operation immediately.

24. Again we moved. On October 3, 1944 we moved to Bioul Castle, Province of Namur, Belgium. (Field Order #11 headquarters 504th Signal Aircraft Warning Battalion, dated 30 September 44 is attached herewith as a supporting document.) All sites took up new locations in four different European Countries; Holland, Belgium, Luxembourg and France. We began to wonder if we would if we would ever stay in one place for a period of one month or longer when all of a sudden we moved again.

25. On 29 October we moved back to Ozoir-La-Ferriere, Seine-etkarne, France. (Field Order #12 Headquarters 504th Signal Aircraft Warning Battalion, dated 28 October 44 is attached herewith as a supporting document) This time we were to be there for several months. Our mission was to supply early warning for the Faris area. Needless to say, Morale was very high.

26. On 12 November 44, COL-A Platoon, which had been left in praiton-sur-Biert, Belgium, awaiting further orders was placed on Detached Service with the 52nd AAA Brigade to supply early warning to that organization. (Special Order #174 Headquarters 564th signal aircraft marning Battalion, dated 12 November 44 is attached herewith as a supporting document.)

27. We won our first medal in the Battalion when Technician Fifth Grade William A. Ballas of Company "A", placed on Temperary Duty with the Red Ball Trucking Company was awarded the Bronze Star Redal for meritorious service in connection with military operations from 19th September 44 to 13 November 44 (General Orders #95, headquarters, TK Air Defense Command dated 20 November 44 is attached herewith as a supporting document.)

28. Nothing much happened outside of normal duties during the month of November. On 15 December 44 the rumor of reorganization which had been floating around for many a month was finally but into effect and the set up was as follows: (General Order #10, headquarters 564th Signal Aircraft Warning Battalion dated 15 December 44 is attached herewith as a supporting document.) T/O and E 11-400, 1 warch 1944, C-1 and 2.



- 1. a. German aircraft, forced to evacuate airfields in France and Belgium, and threatehed in Holland, have returned to Germany proper. Because of the concentration of enemy fighter aircraft at airfields in Germany, and because the battle line is moving into Germany, Allied aircraft can expect to encounter more severe opposition by the Luftwaffe. Jet propelled enemy fighters will probably be used in increasing numbers. At present it is reported that two staffeln, equipped with ME-163, are operational in Northeast and Central Germany. Also two staffeln using ME-262 are operational in Southwest Germany, and one ground attack staffeln, thought to be equipped with ME-262, is located in Western Germany. The fighters engaged in the battle area number some 535. For distribution of these and other type 4/c, see Annex 1, Intelligence Annex. Both the quality and quantity of the GAF effort has taken an upward trend this week, in contrast to the weak and spotty activity recorded during the preceding weeks. While most of the sorties were flown in an effort to break up Eighth Air Force formations, there was a relatively ambitious effort devoted to patrolling and attacking objectives over the various battle area. Night activity, however, remained negligible, with few fighters airborne and no evidence of night bomber operations.





UNIT HISTORY

- 1. The administrative affairs of the Battalion were rather heavy during the month. A "C" team was added from the 500th Signal Aircraft Warning Battalion and a Ground Observers platoon was lost to the 500rd Signal Aircraft Warning Battalion. (Extracts of Special Orders # 36 Headquarters Ninth Air Force, dated 5 February 1845 attached herewith as supporting documents) At the same time the various platoons of the several companies were checked and it was deemed necessary to revise the distribution of some teams for operational purposes. This was carried out. (Letter Headquarters, 564th Signal Aircraft Warning Battalion, Subject: "Company Organization" dated 10 February 45 attached herewith as supporting document.) Several days later we were notified by Ninth Air Force that a "U" team of the 565rd Signal Aircraft Warning Battalion was being asgnd to the Battalion (Special Order 45 F 19 & 20 Headquarters, Ninth Air Force dated 17 February 45 attached herewith as supporting document.) This team, known as Detachment "A" Company "B" 564th Signal Aircraft Warning Battalion was then attached to the XIX Tactical Air Command and has been with them ever since. (Letter Headquarters Minth Air Force Subject: Assignment & Attachment Order (No. 25) dated 22 February 1944 attached herewith as supporting document)
- 2. Operational activity varied from light to very heavy. Mass raids from Britain at night kept the Filter Center operators on their toes and the few enemy plots being picked up every now and then made things more interesting. The lst Gunnery & Fow Target Stuadron (Frov) was contacted and a series of calibration flights for the radars was worked out for daytime when enemy air activity was curtailed.
- 5. Morale lifted as rain replaced the snow and ice, giving indication of an early spring for basket ball and baseball. Lt Klarer Special Service Officer got busy on his equipment and several games had already been played by the time the end of the month rolled around.




UNIT HISTORY

- l. Administratively, this was another busy month for the 564th. Of major impartance was the fact that Lieutenant Colonel GEORGE M. HIGGINSON our Battalion Commander, who had been with us for a year and a half, finally left us to go to IX Air Defense Command as Signal Officer (Special Order 65, Headquarters, IX Air Defense Command dated 6 March 45 attached herewith as supporting document.) A farewell party was held in the Officers Club to wish the Colonel on his way, and it was with deep regret we all bade him good bye.
- 2. Captain Eisenbise, Executive Officer took over control of the organization for a few days until Major RAYMOND F. O'FRAY assumed command on the 19th of Earch 45. (General Order #5, Headquarters, 564th Signal Aircraft Warning Battalion, dated 19 March 45 attached herewith as a supporting document.)
- 5. Notice came thru that our Detachment "a" Corpany "B" had been further attached to the 19th Tactical Control Group (Prov) (Letter Headquarters KIA Tactical Air Command, Subject: "Assignment & Attachment Orders (10. 5) dated 25 February 45 attached herewith as a supporting document.)
- 4. Operationally, the Battalion remained busy. Heavy raids continued from the U.K. at nite and calibrationed flights for the radars went on during the day. CHB-A reported some strange targets on their scale which were finally explained as possible meteorological phenomenon. The high light of the month was the airbourne operations over the Rhine which were followed with great interest. The majority of the flights were lost due to the low altitude at which the planes were flying.
- 5. On 13 March the 564th Signal Aircraft Marning Battalion had the honor of being the first unit to donate type "0" blood in response to an appeal in the Stars and Stripes. One hundred and fifty-two (152) pints of blood were added to the ETO Blood Bank.
- 6. Twenty trucks and drivers returned to us after working on the preparation of an AA firing range at Camp Mailly. With them came a letter of commendation from Colonel P.W. LEWIS, Commanding officer of the 71st AAA Group landing them for the exceptional performance of their duties. (Letter Headquarters, 71st AAA Group subject: "Commendation" dated 9 March 45 attached herewith as supporting document.)
- 7. Notice was received that the first of our battle stars had been authorized (Letter, headquarters ETOUSA Subject: Battle Participation Awards- Normandy campaign (No 4) dated 17 Ear 45 attached herewith as a supporting document.)



UNIT HISTORY

- 1. The month of April 45 started off slowly for us. Rumors of a move were making the rounds as the allied armies moved swiftly ahead into Germany, but outside of the tension this caused, operations proceeded along a normal line. On 8 April 1945 orders were received from Hq IX Air Defense Command awarding the Bronze Star Medal to Tec 4 Bejamin F. Squires. Accordingly, a formal ceremony in front of the Chateau was planned upon. At 1700B 9 April 1945 the entire organization was assembled, citation read to the troops and ribbon presented by Major Raymond F. O'Pray, Battalion Commander. Following the presentation the troops passed in review. (Extract of General Order w10, dtd 24 March 45, Ltr, Subj: Award of the Bronze Star Medal, and Ltr, Subj: Presentation of Award, dtd 4 April 1845 all of Hq IX. Air Defense Command are attached herewith as supporting documents.)
- 2. At the same time orders finally came down to move out. Supplies were loaded and plans were drawn up. Due to a previous commitment by SHAEF to furnish AW to Faris it was decided to leave the two COL platoens in position, tied in to the 47th AAA Brigade, until the rest of the Bn could move ahead and furnish wire communication back to Faris. This policy established, the Bn shut down operations and moved, the first serial leaving Ozoir La Ferriere at 0700B 12 April 1945. (FO #15, Ng 564th Sig AW Bn dtd 10 April 45 attached herewith as a supporting document)
- 3. A field kitchen had left Bn Hq on the night of 11 April 45 and set up a bivouac area near Zimming, France. By the time the Bn convoys caught up with it everything was in good order and an excellant supper was served to the men & officers. Camp was made for the night and as usual, it rained. Nobody got very wet though, and the next morning after another excellant not meal the convoy proceeded into Germany. The Rhine river was reached and crossed in the early afternoon of 13 April 45 at Mainz, Germany and after another 50 minutes drive we had arrived at our destination, Schlosskellerei, Reichartshausen Bei Hattenheim a/RH Germany
- 4. Major O'Pray, who had remained behind with the rear echelon at Ozoir, received his orders placing him on temp dy in the Lone of Interior for the purpose of attending the Senior Comm Officers School at Orlando, Florida. (SO Extract 100, Hq 9 AF, dtd 10 April 45 attached herewith as a supporting document.)
- 5. The filter center had been quickly set up upon arrival and had been ready to operate by the night of 13 April 45. Difficulties with communications were experienced but by 16 April 45 all platoons were contacted and reporting in by CW & FM. A seperate communication platoon was formed and placed on a mountain top five miles from the filter center for an experiment and immediately better communications were the result. The CW Flatons were picked up by this "hadio City" team and piped down by FM to the Filter Center where they were plotted on the board.







- 1. a. This week the mestern and Eastern armies have joined. The behrmacht has been torn to shreds, and in only a few isolated areas is resistance effective. In the South the enemy's resistance is more stubborn, indicating a better organized fighting force. The Luftwaffe, compressed into a narrowing corridor of congested airdremes, is short of fuel to move its aircraft to alternate sites. It has no alternative but to take a series of crushing blows on the ground. In seven days, the GAF lost 1,523 destroyed, 35 probably destroyed and 1,199 damaged on the ground, a total of 2,757. The enemy's offensive effort has, therefore, been held in check, and while he has been able to put 200 to 250 aircraft up on a few days, the average is much below this scale.





ANNEX #1 - Radio Net Diagram



- l. Consolidation of the seperate platoons and companies as contemplated during the latter part of the month was carried out on 4 June 45. - 4. Word was received from IX ADC that two of the EM of the Bn had been awarded the Bronze Star Medal for meritorious service (Ext GO #23 Hq IX ADC dtd l June 45 attached herewith as a supporting document) Accordingly, on the Wednesday evening retreat parade of the 27 June 45 the entire Bn was assembled, citation read to the troops and medals presented by Major Serge T. 

- l. Routine duties played the leading role for the first week of July for every one except the I & E Dept under the supervision of 1st Lt. Edward N. Sanchez, I & E Officer. They, in keeping with Phase II of their program, opened the doors of the school on 9 July 1945, with an enrollment of 227. The schedule of Geometry, Arithmetic, three classes in English, two in Algebra, Morse Code, Trigonometry, American Government, Business Law, and American History embraced a week of five unvarying days, beginning at 0830 and concluding its day at 1400.
- 2. The instructors for the opening session were: S/Sgt Jacob Binn (Geometry), W/O Leon Kanable (Aritmetic), Sgt Joseph Thorpe (English)1 and English 3), Tec 5 James Lampen (Morse Code), Tec 4 Gerald Sears (Trigonometry), Sgt Theodore Alden (English 2), Lt. Douglas Eustace (Algebra 1), Lt William Creamer (Algebra 2), Tec 4 Saul Grand (American Government), S/Sgt William Brownell (Business Law), and Sgt Herbert Hatfield (American History).
- 3. Each succeeding week was marked by expansion. The schedule for 16 July introduced three additional subjects. S/Sgt Wendell Hiersekorn instructed in Auto Mechanics, Pfc Elmer Rocco in Photography, and Tec 5 Charles Trumbo in principles and types of speech. Lt. Robert Dienhart began mechanical drawing the week of 23 July and Pfc Cyrus Woodworth took over the additional class in photography on 30 July.

PART II

NARRATIVE

- l. The transferring in and out of various Officers and Enlisted Men of the 564th Signal Aw Battalion which had started in July went on unchecked all through the month of August. Both high and low Adjusted Service Rating score men were effected. Those with low ASR scores were transferred to new organizations and the high point men were sent to various depots for shipment to the Zone of Interior. Some high point men from other organizations were shifted in temporarily to replace our losses but they in turn were sent out almost immediately. All in all, approximately 400 Officers and Enlisted Men were involved in the movements.
- 2. On August 3rd T/Sgt. Calvin H. Glenn and Cpl. Hilliard B. Black were commended by the Battalion Commander Lieutenant Colonel GEORGE M. HIGGINSON for meritorious conduct in connection with carrying out their duties. (See Appendix for GO #8 Hq, 564th Signal AW Battalion dtd 3 August 1945).
- 3. On the 4th August 1945 notification was received that a Bronze Service Star had been awarded to the organization for the Central Europe Campaign. (See Appendix for Ltr. Hq USFET, dtd 6 July 1944 Subj: Battle Participation Awards--Central Europe Campaign--No 8).
- 4. The 67th Signal AW Detachment (close control), which had been activated during the preceding month and comprised almost entirely of former members of the 564th Signal AW Battalion, had been with us all along. They were then officially assigned to the XII Tactical Air Command and further assigned to this Battalion (See Appendix for GO #138, Hq, XII TAC dtd 31 July 1945).
- 5. During the middle of the month electrifying news of the war in the Pacific was broadcast over the radio. Japan had agreed to surrender and although it was not the official VJ Day, the 564th Signal AW Battalion celebrated along with the rest of the world in a wonderful spree. Lt. Col. HIGGINSON declared the rest of the day a holiday and all the liquor stocks in the two Enlisted Men's bars were put on the counter, free of charge. Several Officers put on bartender aprons and by 1530 the party was in full swing. Except for the guards and drivers still on duty, every one was having a wonderful time and several truckloads of new men which had just arrived from the 582nd Signal AW Battalion quickly joined in.

PART II (CONT'D)

NARRATIVE

- 6. All formality was cast aside for the evening. Lt. Col. HIGGINSON with various other members of the staff joined in with themen and between drinking and serving drinks, along with everyone else had acompletely successful evening. There were some heavy heads and fevered brows the next morning but with the finish of the war and going home now in sight nobody minded in the least.
- 7. Word was received on about the 21st August 1945 that 8 more Enlisted Men had received Bronze Star Awards and though the medals had not arrived making possible a formal presentation, the data was entered in the Service Records and the men officially notified of the honor (See Appendix for Extract of GO #34, Hq IX ADW dtd 15 August 1945).
- 8. With the rapid turnover of Officers and Enlisted Men, Lt. Sanchez, head of the Information & Educa tion School soon found it impossible to maintain any of the teaching staff and he had to give up. A complete halt was brought about with the finish of his last class and on the 24th August 1945 the school closed its doors.
- 9. The training program was also hard hit. Key men of the Battalion, including the Sgt/Major, the 1st Sgts, Clerks, Typists, Radio Operators and Switchboard Operators were taken away from us and it became necessary to abolish the training program in order to keep the Battalion in operation. On the job training was initiated in its place and though conditions remaineddifficult the men were performing satisfactorily in their new jobs as the month of August drew to a close.

August 15: Eighty Enlisted Men joined the 564th Signal AW Battalion from the 582nd Signal AW Battalion. They arrived in time to join in the celebration when the Battalion Commander, Lt. Col. GEORGE M. HIGGINSON declared the day a holiday due to news of the Jap surrender in the Pacific.

August 16-20: No change in duty status. The transfers away from the Battalion now totaled 12 Officers, 1 Warrant Officer and 228 Enlisted Men for the month.

August 21: Notification received from Hq. IX Air Defense Wing that 8 Enlisted Men of the organization had been awarded the Bronze Star.

August 22-23: No change

August 24: The Post Information and Education School closed due to lack of personnel.

August 25-31: On the job training initiated in place of training program due to losses in key personnel of the Battalion.

By the 31st August 1945 the transfer total had risen to 13 Officers, 2 Warrant Officers and 360 Enlisted Men lost during the month of August 1945.
