

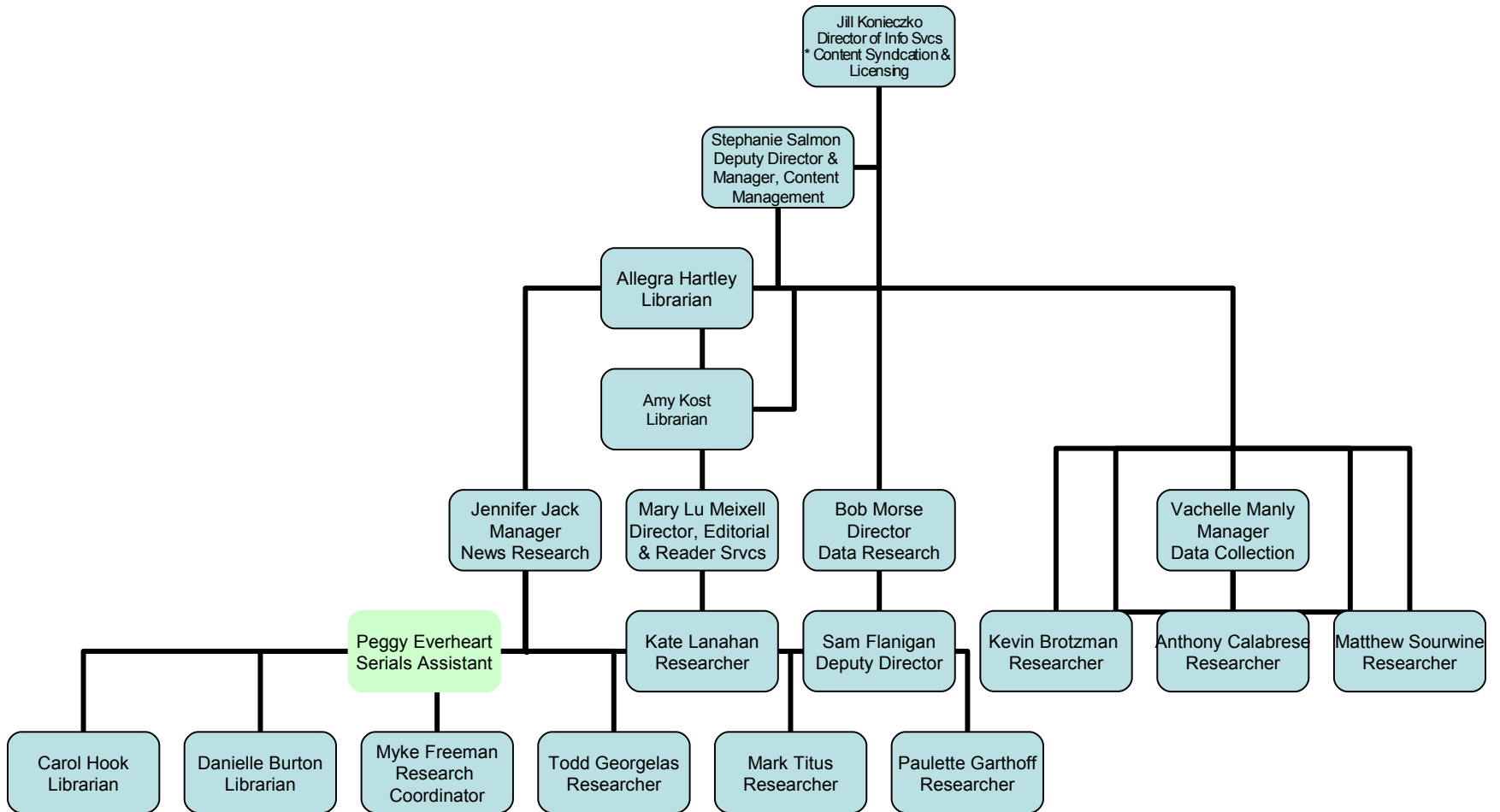

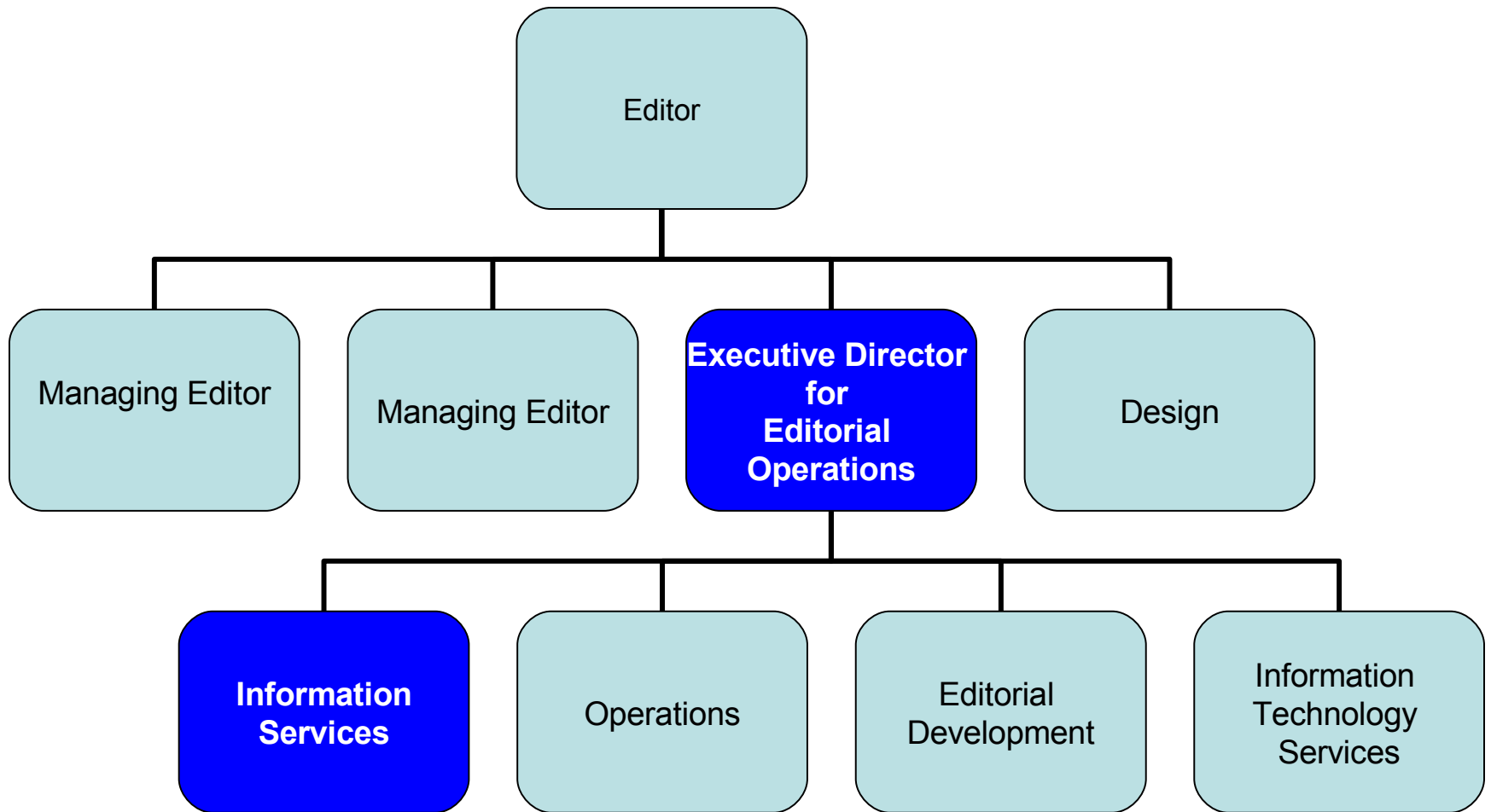

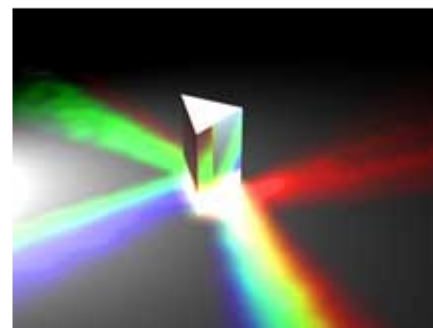

Tips for Using Artesia

Below are some quick tips for easy searching in Artesia. You may also wish to print out the [Artesia cheatsheet](#).

To access Artesia:

Go directly to <http://nemo/teams>. Login as user name *usnews* and password *usnews* (Not creative, but should be easy to remember!). **NOTE:** Be sure to use Internet Explorer -- Artesia and Firefox don't play well together.

Looking for a PDF?

- Logon to Artesia (see above).
- Run a search using the title, slug or contributor(s) name(s) -- (NOTE: Artesia is case sensitive, so watch your capitalization, especially in the *Title* field).
- Narrow by date -- there are lots of options, including the *last 7 days* and the *last 30 days* as well as *date is* and date ranges (such as dates *between*, *after*, and *before*).
- Click in the box labeled *PDF* to select the format.
- Click on the *Search* button.
- Once your results pop up, select the item you're interested in, and from the *Asset Menu*, select *Download*.
- Adobe will then prompt you to Save or Open the file, from which you're free to print or save the document to a local drive.
- **NOTE:** the easiest way to e-mail a PDF from Artesia is to save the document to a local drive, and attach it to your e-mail message.

Looking for a Web exclusive?

- Logon to Artesia (see above).
- Run a search using the *title*, *slug* or *contributor(s)* name(s) -- (NOTE: Artesia is case sensitive, so watch your capitalization, especially in the *Title* field).
- Narrow your search by date -- there are lots of options, including the *last 7 days*, the *last 30 days* as well as *date is* and date ranges (such as dates *between*, *after*, *before*).
- Click **YES** in the box labeled *Web Exclusive*.
- Click on the *Search* button.
- Once your results pop up, select the item you're interested in, and from the *Asset Menu*, select *Download*.
- Your article will pop up in a separate window, from which you can copy and paste into an e-mail message, print, or save to a local drive.

10 Things You Didn't Know About Alberto Gonzales

1. Alberto Gonzales was born in San Antonio on Aug. 4, 1955. He was the second of eight children born to Pablo and Maria Gonzales, who had met as migrant farm workers. The family settled in Humble, Texas (just north of Houston), in a two-bedroom home, which his father and uncles built. The house lacked hot water and the family did not have a telephone until Gonzales was in high school. Gonzales has said that his father's self-reliance and hard work strongly influenced his own political views. Pablo Gonzales died in a work-related fall in 1982.

2. As a child, Gonzales sold soft drinks to fans attending Rice University football games. The school made a big impression on the 12-year-old, and he dreamed of attending college there one day.

3. At MacArthur High School, Gonzales was an honor student and an athlete. He played varsity baseball and was a defensive back and linebacker on the football team.

4. Following his 1973 high school graduation, Gonzales had no money to continue his education, so he joined the Air Force. After two years stationed in Fort Yukon, Alaska, he entered the Air Force Academy, hoping to become a pilot. He was the first in his family to attend college.

5. Gonzales became interested in law after taking a political science class at the academy. Years later, he explained how he decided what to do: "I put it in God's hands. I'd
