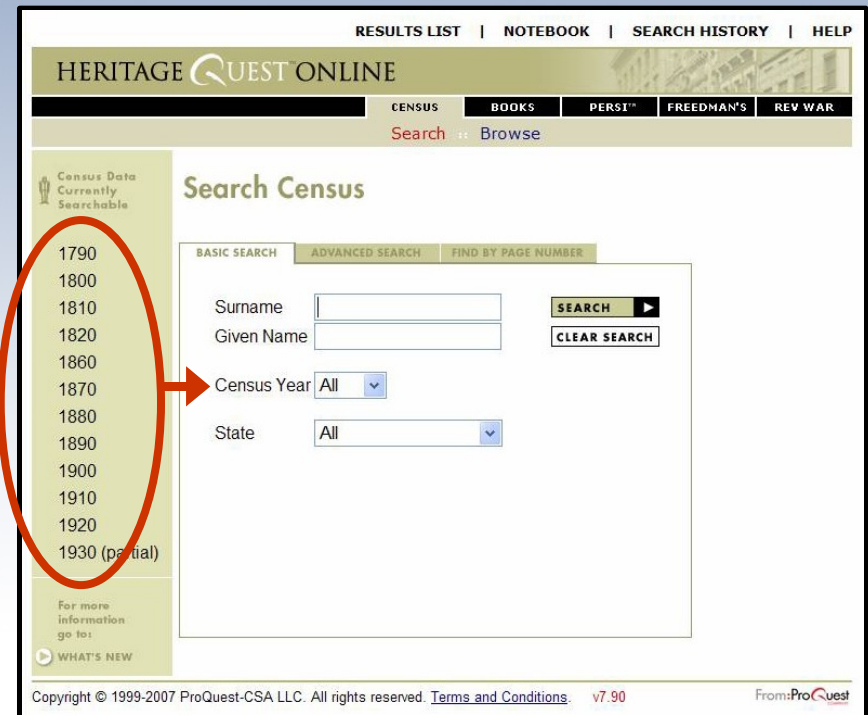

About two weeks ago the following melancholy accident happened in Franklin county: some time in the night the house of Mr. Bowen, junior, took fire and consumed to ashes, the wind blowing very high, the fire communicated to the house of his father, at a distance of about twenty rods, which likewise was consumed--we are informed that a considerable part of the old man's effects were saved, but the former's wife and four children and the whole of his household goods were burnt. 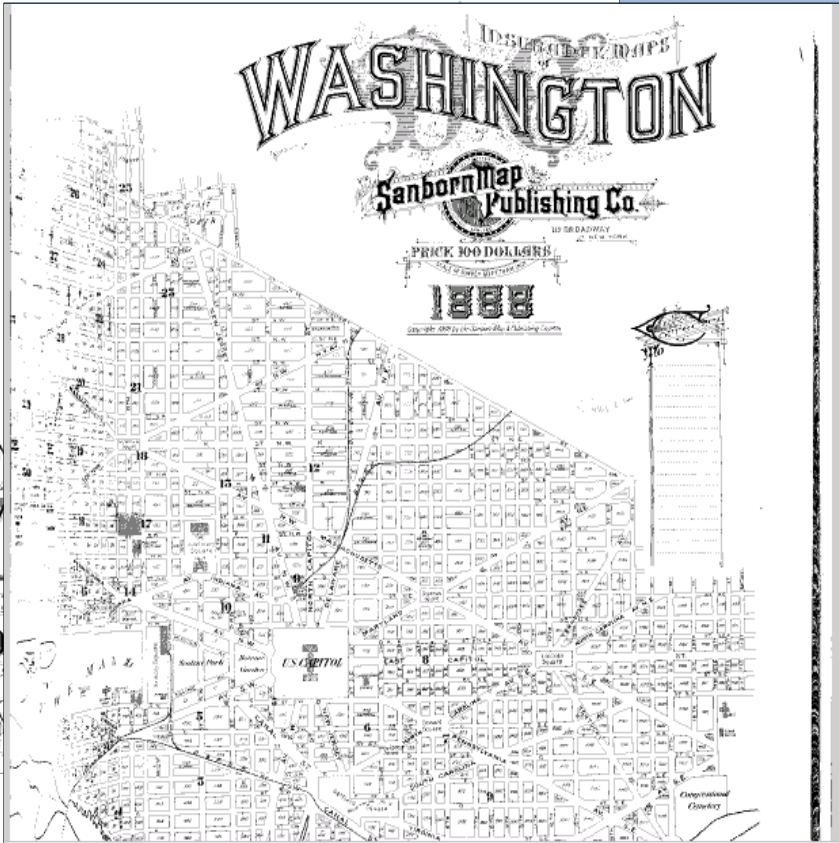
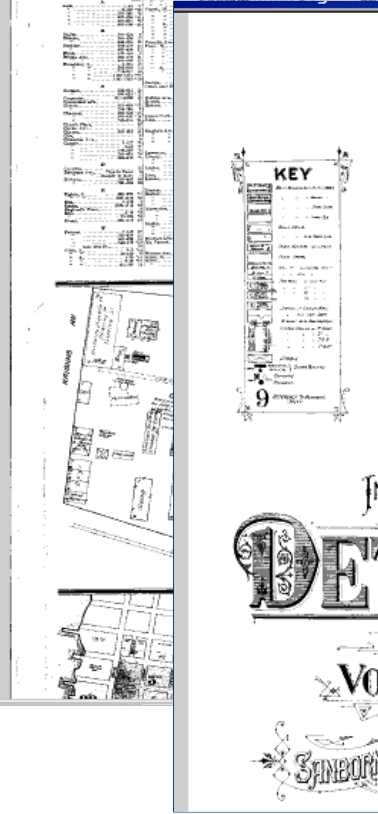
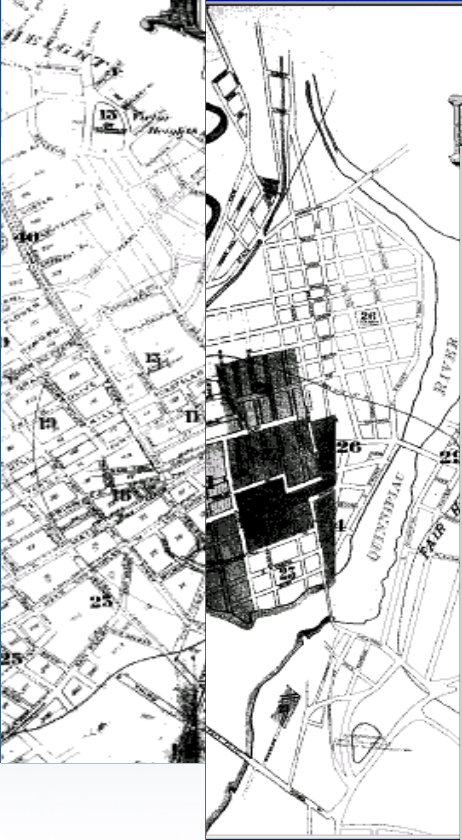
